PORTIFY THE PANAMA CANAL, KAISER SAYS TO COL. GOETHALS.

NEW YORK, March 28—It is the opinion of Emperor William of Germany that the United States will make a great mistake if it does not fortify the Panama Canal thoroughly and maintain a large military force in the canal zone of far greater strength and numbers than at present contemplated, according to Colonel Goethals, chief engineer of the canal, who arrived from Berlin today.

He had an interview with the Emperor, who expressed a desire to see the canal, saying he regretted he would be unable to visit the great ditch.

The Kaiser said he feared the locks of the Panama Canal would not be wide enough to permit of the passage of the giant war vessels of the near future.

CHICAGO SCHOOL BOYS DULL ON SACRED AND BIVEN SECULAR HISTORY.

CHICAGO, March 28—Who were the 12 disciples? This question put 100 boys of Lake Forest academy to perplexity. They were undergoing their yearly general knowledge test.

When the papers were turned in by one by the puzzled young men, Head Master William Mather, Lead, observed that the only question that none had answered correctly or even passably was "Who were the 12 disciples?"

The next query that was "muffed" oftentimes was: "Who led the batting list in the National League last season?"

"As Chicago did not have a winning team last year, we can't blame the boys for forgetting such ephemeral things as names of ball players," said Head Master Leads.

PITTSBURGH BANKER IS STUDENT AT CORNELL.

PITTSBURGH, Pa., March 28—James I. Buchanan, President of the Pittsburgh Trust Company, admitted to curious business cronies today that most of his recent trips out of town are spent in attending college.

Further inquiry revealed that the influential financier, who is a regularly entered student at Cornell University in the School of Farming, was chided recently for "playing hooky."

AMHERST HAS FIRE WHICH DAMAGES MOFFATT BLOCK.

AMHERST, March 28—At 7.30 tonight fire broke out in Concessioner A. W. Moffatt's brick block and the store was badly damaged before the fire was extinguished. Owing to the location of the fire, which was caused by an over-heated furnace pipe, large quantities of water had to be used and the loss to goods is principally from water and smoke. C. H. Watt, proprietor of the Union Boot and Shoe store, has \$5,000 insurance on stock while Mr. Moffatt's building is fully covered. The new motor chemical did good work.

GIVES UP HOME FOR SUFFRAGE.

LONDON, March 28—"I have given up my home, husband and children in order to go into this movement, and I will not go back until women get the vote," cried Mrs. Alice Green, as she was sentenced to four months' imprisonment, after she had refused to be bound over to keep the peace.

Mrs. Green was with a group of Suffragettes sent to prison by Judge Robert Wallace, chairman of the London sessions, at the resumption of the trial of the women accused of window smashing during the raids of March 1 and March 4.

Most of the women were sentenced to four months' imprisonment, but some of them who had been previously convicted were given six months, while one of them, who had been twice previously convicted, had the distinction of getting eight months.
