ANOTHER GERMAN OUTRAGE IN CANADA

Seven Killed, 10 Injured by Cordite Explosion in Beloeil, Quebec.

MONTREAL, July 6.—Seven persons are reported dead and ten more injured in an explosion of cordite this morning at the plant of the Canadian Explosives Ltd., at Beloeil, 25 miles from Montreal. Details of the affair are lacking, but among the rumours is one that the explosion was caused by a young German who was formerly employed there but recently discharged.
