To Reconstruct Protestant Churches in Shattered Europe

Canadian churches, through the Canadian Council of Churches, will launch a campaign shortly to raise \$300,000 for the reconstruction of Protestant churches in Europe. The United Church of Canada has been asked to raise a substantial share of this amount and arrangements have already been completed to ask each of its congregations to make the appeal immediately in order that the necessary funds be collected before the first of September. "We who believe in a world-wide Christian fellowship must come to the aid of the churches in Europe," said Rev. Dr. Gordon A. Sisco, secretary of the General Council of the United Church of Canada, in announcing the appeal. "European churches have been demolished by the score, congregations have been dispersed and ministers forcibly moved from one country to another."
