### MONTREAL WOMAN CONFESSED TO FORGERY.

MONTREAL, Oct. 11.—Madame LaJeunesse, accused of forging the name of Hon. S. N. Parent to cheques for \$230 and \$900, admitted the forgery today and added that she had, with the aid of her husband and a man named Samuel Faret, fraudulently obtained no less a sum than \$5,000 within four years. Cheques had been forged for different amounts and cashed at different places. The gang got caught, however, when they got rid of a cheque for \$230 upon a Mrs. St. Jacques. Sentence will be delivered on Thursday.

### PRIEST AND MARINER COME TO AID OF HATTIE LE BLANC.

BOSTON, Oct. 11.—When Hattie Le Blanc, the seventeen-year-old girl who faces death in the electric chair for the alleged murder of Clarence F. Glover, is called to trial in the East Cambridge Court in January a priest who has known the little French girl from childhood will take the witness stand and testify in her behalf.

He is Father Joseph Robetaille of West Arichat, Cape Breton, the home of the accused girl. Since she was a child old enough to attend church Hattie Le Blanc went to Father Robetaille's church.

The priest and the people of the parish are astounded that the bright little girl who left Cape Breton two years ago, innocent of evil, ignorant of the ways of the big world, is now in prison under the dreadful charge of having taken a human life.

"That child is innocent. She must be saved!"

It is the burden of the cry of the family and who remember the Hattie before she came to Massachusetts. This news of how the people at home regard Hattie was brought to Boston by Captain Peter King.

He knows Hattie Le Blanc. The girl was employed in his daughter's family a good deal before she came to the States. Hints that reflected on Hattie were dropped after the Waltham crime. The girl's name and that of Captain King, old enough to be her grandfather, were connected.

But Captain King is to look after that. He has seen Hattie in the East Cambridge Jail and assured her that he will be at her side when the trial takes place and that he will shatter any evidence that reflects upon her, so far as he is concerned.

"Hattie Le Blanc has a good friend in Father Robetaille," said Captain King to a reporter of the Boston Sunday American. "He has known the girl all her life. He knows the secrets of her heart. Hattie went to church regularly. She was one of the brightest little girls in the church. When there was any gathering in connection with the church where a girl could do anything Hattie was always the first to volunteer."

"I talked with Father Robetaille before I came to Boston. He told me how sorry he was that such a charge could be made against anyone that had ever been connected with his church, let alone a little girl."

"Father Robetaille told me that he wanted me to find out if it would serve any purpose for him to come to Boston and testify for Hattie. He said that he could tell the jury that she had always been an honest and industrious girl. He said that he could tell a story on the stand that would show that Hattie had not a vicious drop of blood in her veins."

"State Detective Byrnes saw Father Robetaille. I think he obtained an affidavit from the priest. That affidavit contains a statement that is in favor of Hattie."

"The priest says that he will not put the State to the expense of bringing him to Boston, if he is needed to help save the accused girl. He will pay his own expenses."

"I know that he could help Hattie Le Blanc a great deal. In a case of this character the reputation of the girl when she came here and went to work in the Glover family would naturally have much weight."

"Father Robetaille has been in the same parish for about a dozen years, so that he has known Hattie since she was old enough to go to church."
