### MISS STONE AND THE BRIGANDS.

The case of Miss Ellen M. Stone  
American missionary, who was abducted  
by brigands, has attracted a great deal of  
attention in the press of late. Miss Stone,  
judged by her published photographs, is  
a lady of considerable avoirdupois and  
anywhere from forty to fifty years of age.  
She was sent out years ago by the First  
Congregationalist Church of Chelsea,  
Mass., to Salonica, Macedonia. Salonica  
is a seaport on the Aegean Sea, with a  
population of some 70,000, and is connected  
by a railway running northward into the  
interior. The population is mainly of the  
Greek Church, although the country is  
under Turkish rule. Miss Stone had a  
number of native teachers under her, one  
of whom, Mrs. Tsilka, was carried off with  
her and now shares her captivity.

The mission extended over a wide area,  
north, east and west of Salonica, and  
mention is made of many converts in  
Macedonia, and of a large boy's school  
in Albania with three teachers as the  
result of efforts under Miss Stone's  
direction. Macedonia, as we have said,  
under Turkish rule, and the Porte is  
hostile to the missions on general  
grounds. The Macedonian Committee  
spoken of in the despatches, represents a  
revolutionary party whose object is to  
free their country from the Turkish  
yoke. Miss Stone was carried by the  
brigands into the mountains on the  
border between Bulgaria and Roumelia.  
They demand a ransom of \$125,000.  
Samakov, where the brigands propose  
that the ransom shall be paid over, is  
in Bulgaria, on the line of railway, 30  
miles south east of Sophia, and a like  
distance from the mountain-chain which  
forms the boundary between Bulgaria  
and Roumelia.

Bulgaria is independent, and this com-  
plicates the question as to responsibility.  
Miss Stone has traversed this mountainous  
region on the border for years past undis-  
turbed. Turkey denies responsibility for  
the abduction. So does Bulgaria. It is even  
affirmed that the brigands who carried  
off Miss Stone are Christians. When the  
brigands are pressed by the Bulgarian  
police they cross into Turkish territory,  
and when they meet with Turkish police  
or soldiery they retire into Bulgaria. The  
revolutionary party in Macedonia are  
pleased to see trouble of almost any kind  
as it may further their object. It is  
believed that Miss Stone's life has been so  
far spared, although the date fixed by the  
brigands within which her life would be  
taken if the ransom was not paid, has  
expired. The case is a most complicated  
and difficult one, and there is naturally  
great sympathetic interest in America  
on Miss Stone's behalf.

The much-talked-of Liberal Convention

Reynold's Weekly newspaper repeats  
the rumors circulated a while ago and

hope and pray that the sensational report  
may be found to be unfounded. The  
statement is however made so circum-  
stantially as to cause serious anxiety,  
pending another authoritative contra-  
diction.

There is great need of a duly qualified  
building inspector in this city and of a  
by law defining the character of new  
buildings or additions that may be erected  
within the central parts. The security of  
other property is endangered by the  
erection of wooden buildings of greater  
height than is permitted in other cities.  
We trust the City Council will give the  
matter their early attention. At present  
any man who chooses to build anew or  
add to an old building is permitted to be  
a law unto himself.

It is admittedly desirable that Hon.  
Mr. Foster should be in Parliament and  
there are one or two safe Conservative  
seats now vacant. Among them is West  
York, recently represented by Hon.  
Clarke Wallace. But there is trouble  
in the way. The Orange body is very  
strong in the riding and Sir Mackenzie  
Bowell has influence enough there to  
prevent the nomination of a former  
colleague who tried to turn him out of  
the Premiership. It is pretty safe to  
say that Mr. Foster will not be nominat-  
ed in West York.

## SOUTH AFRICAN GOLD.

The productiveness of the great gold  
mining region commonly known as The  
Rand and situated near Johannesburg is  
at present merely nominal. During the  
war the mining operations were almost  
wholly suspended, although the Boers  
carried on a small portion of the works  
to provide the means of conducting the  
war. The value of the surface plants  
alone at the time the war broke out, was  
about \$125,000,000. It is now estimated  
that 40 per cent of that vast sum will be  
required to place them in a state of  
efficiency and productiveness equal to  
that before the war. Only one of the  
milling plants was actually destroyed but  
all have suffered great deterioration.

The various companies interested have  
long been making preparations to resume  
operations, and vast supplies have been  
shipped to Durban and Delagoa Bay for  
that purpose, where they await the con-  
clusion of hostilities. Until the danger  
from Boer raids is over these supplies  
cannot be forwarded. It is also to be  
observed that the railway lines are and  
have been down to the present taxed to  
their utmost with forwarding military  
supplies and the movement of troops.  
Another obstacle to the early resumption  
of mining operations is the dispersion of  
the labor formerly employed. In 1898,  
before the war 116,000 blacks and 10,000  
whites were employed in the mines.  
When the war is over and preparatory  
completed the intention is to carry on  
gold mining upon an enormous scale and  
with improved methods that will give a  
production much larger than ever before.

According to the latest reports there  
were in the British refuge camps in South  
Africa 93,000 white women and children  
and 24,000 natives, a total of 117,000. The  
natives, in many cases had been servants  
and employees of the Boers. The com-  
plaint had been made that the mortality  
among children in these camps is very  
high. It is explained on the part of the  
British military authorities that this  
mortality results in large measure from  
the Boer mothers refusing to permit their  
sick children to be cared for in the  
hospital, which is attached to each of the  
thirty or forty camps.

Santos Dumont has a rival in Herr Kress  
of Lower Austria, whose air-ship is de-  
signed to start aloft in the water, and  
when the speed of the machinery is put  
on, to rise into the air like a waterfowl.  
Herr Kress has been working on his  
machine for 25 years. At a recent trial  
his air-ship actually arose from the water  
but when only a few feet in the air it was  
struck by a terrific squall, turned over,  
and went to the bottom of the lake. Herr  
Kress, who is now a comparatively old  
man, only escaped drowning by means of  
a life belt which he had on. He will fish  
up his craft and try again.
