**APPLICATION REFUSED.**

Minister of Agriculture holds that the Manufacture of Oleomargarine Would Hurt Canadian Butter.

OTTAWA, July 29.—An example of the care that is taken of Canadian interests by the Minister of Agriculture is to be seen in the refusal of the application of a Montreal firm for power to manufacture and export in bond oleomargarine. Hon Mr. Fisher took the ground that to recognize any such industry would be to prejudice the excellent reputation which Canadian butter now has in the British market. It will be remembered that as the result of persistent efforts, Canadian butter has become popular in the Old Land, now ranking with the best Danish. It is held that to imperil this position would be a blow to the just interests of the Canadian farm.

**DOMINION ALLIANCE.**

Executive Committee Formulates Plan of Campaign Dealing With the Recent Plebiscite.

OTTAWA, July 29.—(Special.)—The executive committee of the Dominion Alliance yesterday outlined a plan of campaign dealing with the recent plebiscite. The executive contends that the average majority for prohibition was much larger than would appear from the returns when the vote as a whole is carefully examined. With exception of Quebec, which gave a majority of 94,324 against the measure, all the other provinces voted overwhelmingly in favor of prohibition. The total number of votes polled was 391,877, and of these 249,944 voted for and 141,933 against prohibition. It is pointed out that the number of members of parliament is 148, and the number whose constituencies voted for prohibition is 121, while only 27 ridings were registered against the enactment of such a measure. It is shown that the average majority for prohibition was 1,034, while the average majority against was 633.

The Alliance claims that the result of the plebiscite was sufficient to warrant the Government enacting a prohibitory measure. The friends of prohibition are urged to take such steps as they deem best adapted to secure the defeat of any political candidate not in favor of prohibition.
