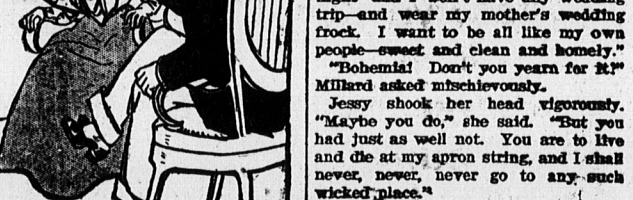

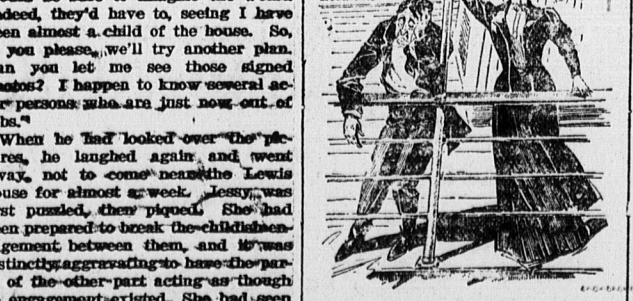

VACCINATION NOTICE. In accordance with the provisions of the Vaccination Act, 1886, the Superintendent of Vaccination for Charlottetown will be at the office of the undersigned, 178 Kent Street, on Wednesday and Saturday from 1.30 to 3.30 p.m. and 6.30 to 9 p.m. The Law requires that all unvaccinated persons of the age of three months or upwards, must be present to be vaccinated; children under twelve years of age to be brought by one of their parents or their guardian. The charge for vaccination will be twenty-five cents for each person to be paid at the time of such vaccination. Any person failing or neglecting to attend, or bring his or her young children, at the above time and place will be subject to the fines and penalties of the vaccination Act. H. D.
