—Louis Taylor, a Micmac Indian, born near Summerside, P. E. I., in the year 1818 died at New Glasgow, N. S., on Saturday the 12th inst. He left P. E. Island when nine years of age. His eldest son Michael of Dartmouth is 62 years of age. The deceased at the time of his death was the oldest man of his race from Strait of Canseau to Cumberland.

—Ex-Mayor George Brown died this morning, aged seventy-nine years. He was born at Chatham Head and was a prominent contractor until his recent retirement owing to age. He was a member of the Orange order and a Presbyterian and is survived by his second wife, formerly Miss Sarah Nicholson, of Chatham and the following children David, R. C. and Wilmot, of Burton; Harry and Mrs. Stephen Finley, of Aspen, Colorado; Mrs. Deveraux Sogaponak, Long Island; Mrs. Myer Moss, Toronto; James in Mexico, and Osborne, at McGill University. Deceased also leaves two older brothers, William and Andrew, of Bedeque, P. E. I.—St. John Telegraph. Deceased is well known in Summerside, where he has often visited his brothers.

—At his home, Filmore, Sask., the death occurred of Henry Crockett, formerly of Cape Traverse, Prince Edward Island, at the age of fifty-six years. The late Mr. Crockett had been in failing health for a number of years, and came to this country two years ago with the hope of recovering from his illness, but did not prove successful. Howatt, Cape Traverse, all of Prince Edward Island, and Mrs. Andrew Aiton of Sussex, N. B.

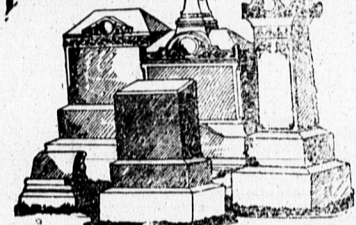
