ST. JOHN'S Nfld., Oct. 13 — (CP Cable) — A party of Ptarmigan hunters, who dropped their guns to rig a beach buoy for a crew of shipwrecked mariners, were discovered tonight to have saved all 47 men aboard the ship after it ran aground on the forbidding Newfoundland coast.

ROCHESTER, N. Y., Oct. 13 — (CP) — Canada's Labor Minister, Hon. Humphrey Mitchell, tonight told the American Society of Mechanical Engineers that Canada has made a "remarkable" transition from peace to war economy, and now is the "arsenal as well as the bread basket" of the British Empire.

Transport Is Lost Also In Big Engagement

Enemy was seeking to land Reinforcements on Guadalcanal

WASHINGTON, Oct. 13 — (AP) — The United States Navy announced tonight that a Japanese cruiser, four destroyers and a transport had been sunk in a big naval battle in the Solomon Islands area and that another cruiser and a destroyer had been badly damaged.

Rescued only 30 feet offshore, the ship's crewmen were barred from safety by high, bluff cliffs until the hunting party from St. John's came to their rescue. The sportsmen — Gordon Higgins, Charles Godden and James McLaughan — were at their camp on the southern coast of Newfoundland when distress flares from the ship were sighted.

- LONDON, Oct. 13 — (CP) — Prime Minister Jan Christiaan Smuts of South Africa has arrived in Britain for war talks today and is expected to stay for more than a week, the Dominion office announced tonight.
- OTTAWA, Oct. 13 — (CP) — The Agriculture Department announced today that the British Food Minister has advised that it is prepared to purchase an additional quantity of cheese above the 125,000,000 pounds provided for in an agreement covering the 12 months ending March 31 next.
