THE UNHEEDING GOD

This week's Wesleyan says: This is a title of a book of sermons by Rev. Thomas G. Selby because the text of one of the discourses reads: "And it shall come to pass at that time that I will search Jerusalem with candles, and I will punish the men who are settled upon their lees, that say in their hearts, The Lord will not do good neither will he do evil." We will not follow the sermon but use the text for our purpose. There are many, in this day of gloom, who are asking, "Why does God allow all this carnage? Does God care? Many are like the disciples who exclaimed, when the boat was in danger of being engulfed by the raging waters, "Master, carest thou not that we perish?" Some make these inquiries because of their deep sympathy for the suffering and longing desire that God would save the stricken world, and some because of a practical atheism which has no place for God in the ruling of the universe.

There are those who believe in a great first cause as an inscrutable and ever persisting force, possessed of intelligence but devoid of any moral affections or susceptibilities, whose laws are so inexorable that there is no room for any moral interpositions. There are others who whilst believing in a personal, conscious, and intelligent God, think of Him as one who is of such a languid, Laodicean disposition that he does not trouble himself with distinctions between right and wrong, or with what men are thinking and doing.

This latter conception of Deity commends itself to those who are themselves indifferent about moral distinctions and careless about good and evil. They would feign believe that God is such an one as themselves who will not bring their lives into scrutiny of judgment.

But God resents such a libel upon his character. He will search out all such neglectors and violators of his holy laws and call them to severest account. There can be no hiding from his search or refuge from his judgments. Some of the monsters of the present day, regardless of treaties and covenants into which they willingly entered, without regarding the distinctions between good and evil have impudently claimed by their "Me and God," to be in partnership with Jehovah in the most horrible atrocities perpetrated upon the human race, but God will search them out, and they will stand aghast at his judgments.

Yes, God cares. He is not like an artificer who builds a house and then leaves it, and is gone; but like a pilot who with a constant care steers on the ship of the whole creation. He does not save her from storms or tempests but through them all he keeps her on her course until she reaches the desired haven.

All things are not for the best in themselves. There is no inherent power in the evil to develop good. Evil must ever gravitate towards an increase of itself but by the virtue of an overruling wisdom the Omnipotent One can bring good out of evil, and convert the evil itself into an instrument for good. This he does even in the natural world where storms, destructive of life and property, fill the atmosphere with the sources of a larger and purer life.

The past history of the world is one long illustration of this truth. From pride and wrath of man that brought about the crucifixion of the Christ through all the sordid and tragic history of the race the God of all justice and mercy has made the wrath of man to praise Him and has overruled the greatest tragedies of the human history so as to rebound to his own glory and the ultimate benefit of the race.

This He will continue to do. Let not fearful hearts give away to despair. "The Lord God Omnipotent reigneth." Though so high "He seeth the sparrow when it falls." One of old asked "Doth God take care for oxen?" It was answered that he did and emphasized that he careth much more for man. Let us not forget that God cares. "Behind the dim unknown, Standeth God within the shadow, keeping watch above His own."
