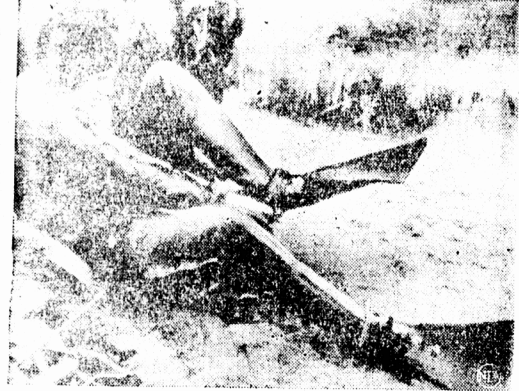


These Maritimers have arrived back in Canada from overseas and will be reunited with their families in a day or so. Their smiling faces are an indication of their feelings about being back.

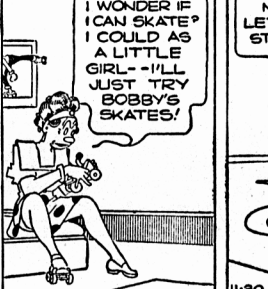

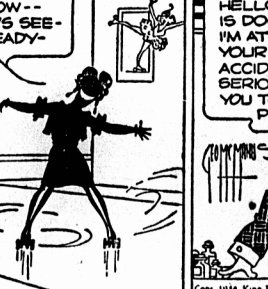
