WOMEN'S INSTITUTE EXECUTIVE MEETING A meeting of the Provincial Executive of the Women's Institute was held on November 14, 1930 at 1 o'clock. The minutes of the last meeting were read and adopted. It was moved and seconded that the Women's Institute in future conduct a Demonstration Booth at the Provincial Exhibition and also to give it publicity beforehand. An exhibit at the Canadian National Exhibition was discussed and Mrs. Tait was asked to write to Mr. Putman for information. It was moved by Mrs. Shaw and seconded by Mrs. Martin that the following resolution, which was forwarded to the Supervisor from Long Creek District Convention, be adopted and read:—"Whereas the drinking of intoxicating liquors is becoming more prevalent throughout our province; and whereas, education the best method of counteracting this evil, is urgently needed; and whereas, very little education, in this respect, is being especially supplied to the youth of our land to whom we look for a solution of this problem. Be it therefore resolved that the Women's Institute in convention, assembled on this date at Long Creek, place themselves on record as favoring the inclusion in the Curriculum of the schools of this province a course of studies dealing with the liquor evil, and that the Government of this province be presented with a copy of this resolution with the request that immediate action be taken on the matter." It was moved by Mrs. MacDonald and seconded by Mrs. MacMillan that "the Rest Room Resolution" be presented to the various organizations and to the government for approval. It was moved and seconded that the Supervisor, Mrs. Mutch, Mrs. Shaw and Mrs. George MacDonald be appointed to wait on the government to present these resolutions. A discussion then took place re Handicraft Exchange. It was decided that the Exchange be under the supervision of the Women's Institute Office and be conducted as in former years. Members present at this meeting were Mrs. Mutch, president; Mrs. Shaw, Mrs. MacMillan, Mrs. MacDonald, Mrs. Martin, Mrs. Rose and Miss Yeo, Secretary.
