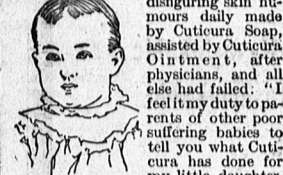

### JOHN BURNS AS A CABINET MINISTER

An Account of the Manner of Man. The British Labor Leader is in Daily Life—Is His Own Footman—What Influences His Character.

LONDON, March 31.—When a man has achieved the proud pre-eminence of being a Cabinet Minister he may be pardoned if he pleads that he has no time to give to the casual caller or to the journalist, except on a matter of national importance.

The only person who would be the last to forgive the President of the Local Government Board if he adopted such a course of action, would be Mr. John Burns himself. What he was is what he is: as simple and as unaffected, now that his brilliant talents have received the recognition of the state, as he was in the old days when he had his way to make—and it was proving anything but an easy way at that.

### HIS UNIQUE PERSONALITY.

That Mr. Burns is a unique personality every reader of "The Bits" knows. He is unique among all the members of His Majesty's Government in having a Cabinet Minister for a footman. When the representative of "The Bits" rang the bell of his house, it was Mr. Burns himself who opened the door. Early in the morning as it was, he was showing a visitor out, and it would be difficult to say how many had been there before.

Mr. Burns is an early riser, as the "Fit-Bits" man had found on a previous visit, when he arrived and discovered that the right Hon. gentleman had left the house in order to keep an appointment at the Home Office at nine o'clock.

On that occasion Mrs. Burns opened the door and accorded a delightful chat to the representative of this paper, a chat in which her admiration for her husband and her affection for her husband showed itself at every other turn, and gave an inkling of the happy relations which have existed ever since the memorable day when she saw Mr. Burns arrested for speaking in a park, and her indignation was so fired at the outrage that it broke down such barriers as had hitherto prevented their engagement, for Mr. Burns was in love with the lady who became his wife from the time he was sixteen.

The books which are the chief feature in the working part of Mr. Burns' house—the three rooms of the ground floor which form his library—have played so prominent a part in the many articles which have been written about him that they may be dismissed with a passing reference. What is not generally known is that pictures have exercised a good deal of influence on John Burns. There are, for instance, in the front room, in which Mr. Burns works, four black-and-white pictures. Among them are reproductions of two of Rossetti's best-known pictures—"The Annunciation" and the "Beata Beatrix"—the latter so full of interest for all who love the painter-poet's work, as it represents Rossetti's vision of his dead wife. It was painted after her death, and was the monument of his raised to her memory. In speaking of these pictures Mr. Burns remarked, "Rossetti, Morris, and Turner each has his claim on me."

To the man who has made Battersea not merely the study but the love of his life, the man who has done so much for the beautifying of the conditions under which his friends and neighbors live and move and are their being the past history of Battersea is full of interest, and on the walls of the breakfast-room are many scarce reproductions of pictures dealing with the appearance of that suburb in the past.
