PRISONERS OF HOPE.

During two months that steam communication with the mainland was wholly cut off last winter not more than forty passengers crossed by the ice-boats at the Capes—an approximately equal number each way. There were at the date of the last census 103,258 persons on this island. Of these 103,258 were practically prisoners, under sentence for "sixty days without the option of a fine." The entire Province was almost dead to the world, bound hand and foot in the winter's grave-clothes of snow and ice. A summer paradise the island is, but blighted in winter with the curse of Iceland.

We looked to our union with Canada as an act of emancipation. Promise was given that the union should break our winter chains, open the prison doors, set wide a gate for passage by men and trade at all seasons and place us on an equality with our sister Provinces. We have waited thirty-two years for the fulfillment of the pledge. Instead of relief we find our winter bondage more intensified in recent years. Now the call of a united people goes up that our shackles may be broken and we believe the sense of justice and right among our fellow Canadians of the Mainland is strong enough to grant us the

relief we seek by the one only known remedy, the construction of the Tunnel.

There are seventy members of the House of Commons who belong to the Roman Catholic Church. They are divided among the Provinces as follows: Nova Scotia 4, New Brunswick 3, Prince Edward Island 1, Quebec 53, Ontario 7, Manitoba 1, British Columbia 1.

Judge Hall of the Superior Court of Augusta, Maine on 18th April imposed a fine of \$500 on an indictment against H. L. Simpson, a prominent druggist of Waterville for illegal sale of intoxicants, and in addition compelled him to enter into a bond for \$1,000 not to further violate the prohibitory law for two years. The druggist clauses of the prohibitory law in this city are mild compared with those of the Mainland.

The Anglo Japanese alliance was signed on the 30th January 1902 and to be in force five years. Twelve months before the expiry of that period notice may be given to terminate the treaty on 30th January 1907. If such notice is not given then or thereafter, the treaty will remain in force. The leaders of the Liberal party in Great Britain opposed the treaty in 1902 and the possibility of a change of Government gives rise to some concern as to the fate of the treaty when such change shall occur. The denunciation of the treaty would not now be popular. The alliance was concluded for the special purpose of maintaining the independence and territorial integrity of China and Korea. That object is still desirable to the British mind. The dangers of Britain becoming involved in war because of the alliance have so far passed harmlessly. Moreover there is general belief that the continuance of the alliance will make for peace in the Far East. Be all this as it may the time is now drawing near in January next, when either Japan or Britain may give the twelve months notice which would terminate the treaty of alliance.
