Farm Notes

Canada's Fruit Trade

FEWER APPLES

Canada's exports of fruit to Britain in 1931 are dealt with in the report issued by the Empire Marketing Board, on "Fruit Supplies in 1931" Canada, as in 1930, took first place last year as the supplier of apples to the United Kingdom.

ORANGES MOST POPULAR

For the first time in record, oranges proved the most popular fruit. Apples have hitherto held pride of place, but came second last year on account of the light home crop, with bananas third.

COMPARISON WITH GERMANY

Interesting comparisons between the consumption of fruit in Germany and in the United Kingdom are given in the report. Imports of apples into the United Kingdom have increased by 80 per cent. since 1913, but have fallen, in Germany, by over 40 per cent.

SLOWER THAN LAST YEAR

Figures supplied by the current issue of the Dominion Live Stock Market Review show that the movement of store stock to country points is much slower than it was last year.
