MARCONI'S TRIUMPH.

Marconi publicly announces that he has established wireless telegraphy between Cape Breton and Cornwall with complete success. It appears from a more detailed statement that the first despatches transmitted inaugurating the service were from Lord Minto to King Edward and also to the King of Italy, but that no replies have been received on this side owing to the fact that the Cape Breton station is better equipped for the transmission than for the reception of messages. This is a mere temporary difficulty and will no doubt be presently overcome, for if the receiving instruments in Cornwall are already adequate for their work there is no reason to fear a like efficiency will not be established at this end of the line in due time.

Marconi's triumph marks an era in telegraphic communication, the full significance of which we shall realize more fully in the years to come. In the meantime it is a source of patriotic pride and satisfaction that the great success now inaugurated is between the Mother Country and Canada. It turns the eyes of the world for the moment toward the British possessions and shows at a glance that with possessions that girdle the entire globe, the wireless system may be expected to speedily give new and instant means of communication between the central kingdoms and the remotest colonies and dependencies.

THE HAGUE TRIBUNAL.

To the Czar of Russia, and much it is to his credit, we owe the establishment of the Hague tribunal for the settlement of international controversies and disputes. Few persons are perhaps aware of the extent to which this means of peaceful and fair settlement has been taken advantage of. The Literary Digest of New York furnishes the following list of cases now pending or already adjudicated:

England and Brazil: Delimitation of Guiana frontiers.
France and Venezuela: Indemnity to French subjects for losses sustained during the revolution.
France and Chili: Exploitation of guano deposits.
Italy and Peru: Interpretation of the treaty of commerce, concluded between the two countries.
Italy and Guatemala: Rights of Italian in Guatemala.
United States and Salvador: Reclamations with regard to the Society of Commerce of Salvador.
United States and Mexico: Right of possession over the ecclesiastical fund of California. (Adjudicated.)

It may be said that these cases are not of the first importance or of very great gravity and yet almost any one of them might in past ages have given rise to a long and bloody war. There is also to be noted a considerable reluctance of the powers to submit their differences to the Hague tribunal. But in such cases there is still a growing disposition to arbitrate in some way, usually by a court of arbitration specially agreed upon between the parties, as in the case of the Alabama claims. What is apparent is that there is a growing disposition to settle international differences by peaceful means. As it is, the Hague tribunal has now before it matters sufficient to occupy all its time.

Rockefeller's Christmas gift to the University of Chicago is a million dollars. But that represents only five cents a gallon profit on twenty million gallons of oil. The people pay it in tribute to the oil trust and the trust magnate gives it to the university.

The death of Mrs. Grant, widow of the late General and President Grant serves to recall that when he died, and it was proposed that his remains should rest in a splendid mausoleum, she insisted that her remains should be placed beside his when she should die. Otherwise she would have him buried where she could be with him in death. Her wishes were regarded and two sarcophagi exactly similar were placed in the mausoleum. In the vacant one the remains of Mrs. Grant have now been placed.

In President Cleveland's time when the Women's Christian Temperance Union objected to the nude figures in a notable painting he had the objectionable work of art removed from the White House. The painting was a gift from George Frederic Watts, an English painter, to the American people, and represents Love assisting Life up the rugged steps of existence. President Roosevelt is reported to have had the painting restored to the White House. And now what will the ladies say?

We are glad to find many evidences that the P. E. Island Hospital, built and so generously supported by the people of the Island is very heartily appreciated by the patients treated within its walls. The following is a case in point: A patient who had undergone a severe operation and was in the hospital for several weeks, writes to one connected with the institution: "I am grateful to you for all your kind treatment towards us and shall never forget it. My recollection of you and the Hospital shall ever be a bright spot in my life." The institution is doing a great and good work in the alleviation and removal of human suffering, and it is only right that those who donate money for its support should know that their generosity and the care of the hospital attendants professional and otherwise are appreciated by the patients.

The Standard Oil trust has been held up, and justly so, as one of the least objectionable of the great combines. It has at its head so good a man as Rockefeller, and to do it justice, has not been quite so utterly regardless of the public interests as have some of the other trusts. And yet this trust has raised the price of oil 25 cents per gallon since the coal strike began. At the same time the concern declares a quarterly dividend of 10 per cent, making, with one larger and other dividends before paid 45 per cent for the year! The fact is that the oil monopoly possesses a power of taxation upon the people about as effective as that possessed by the Government of the United States. The money is taken from the pockets of the people in exorbitant prices, while 45 per cent dividends enable Rockefeller to play the benefactor by giving away a million at a time.

The Examiner is informed that Mr. Justice Hodgson holds that in the case of third offences against the Prohibitory Law there is no power given to the prosecutor to procure the issue of an execution to put the offender into prison; that the prosecutor's power is limited to the collection of the fines to be followed by imprisonment if the fines are not paid; that the Canada Temperance Act does empower the prosecutor to procure the imprisonment of an offender for a third offence, and that the offender is liable to imprisonment for a third offence under the Prohibitory Act is clear; for the statute says so; but the proceedings shall be taken in the name of the King and not in that of the prosecutor. The point is not one on which laymen can pronounce any authoritative opinion, whatever may be their doubts. On one matter there seems to be no doubt, however. The violators of the Prohibitory Law have more resourceful defenders than some honest citizens who are occasionally brought into court.
