## A TRIP TO CANSO AND THEREABOUTS

### A Description of a Voyage From Charlottetown to That Locality

Leaving Charlottetown on a glorious morning in August with sea and sky in happy union we boarded the good ship Halifax for our contemplated trip. After a cheerful goodby, and a bon voyage from the friends who came to see us off, we moved from the wharf and the dancing waves bade fair to make our sail over to Hawksbury a delightful one.

No fears of mal de mer to assail us. Steamer chairs were brought into requisition and we settled ourselves for the promised enjoyment.

As the receding shores dropped away from our vision and everyone who has visited Charlottetown knows how pretty the City looks departing from or arriving at, we looked around in quiet observation of our fellow passengers.

It is a well known fact that acquaintances are made much more rapidly on ship board than on terra firma so we were soon in conversation with some very charming people from Toronto who were returning from one of P. E. Island's delightful summer resorts.

Anyone who has read Charles Dudley Warner's *Baddeck* and that sort of thing is familiar with the beautiful scenery of the far famed Gut of Canso. We were fortunate enough to have a glorious morning at Hawksbury and the exquisite mist hovering over the frowning peak of Cape Porcupine made it an especial point of interest and the view of it we left regretfully.

It would be quite easy to make word pictures of this beautiful locality which abounds in striking features in which sea and shore, passing ships and fishing folk in tossing boats furnish ample material. Of course beauty always depends upon what is responsive to the eyes that behold it.

At Hawksbury we met some charming Americans who were also loud in admiration of the scenery which was quite a novel to them as to us. Whilst crossing in a sail boat over to Port Mulgrave their witticisms and ready repartee was provocative of much laughter and merriment making us feel regretful when we took leave of them.

The coast of Canso and the Islands in the vicinity are most romantic and wild presenting to the ocean rough bold cliffs. Certainly the soil is very sterile supporting only scraggy spruces, cranberries and other low growing plants.

Canso itself is situated at the south eastern extremity of Guysboro which is the shire town. Everywhere you go naked granite rock is to be seen so different to our lovely P. E. Island verdure where you can scarcely get a stone to shy at a cat that we appreciate the novelty of the situation. The most important features shown here are its fisheries and the establishment of the Western Union Cable.

Hazel Hill about 2 miles from the town of Canso is an extremely pretty spot with a chain of lakes positively enchanting in their beauty. This place is noted as the centre of the Commercial Cable Co.

The very pretty residences a majority of them being built by the Company together with the Cable office a splendid looking building are looking out upon the lakes which are dotted with little Islands and pretty surrounding points, at one of which stands the boat houses and where a member of party skiffs are moored, make it a picture well worth seeing.

The cable men have splendid tennis courts upon which we saw some capital playing. No ill feeling is fostered by a *Victorious* game and the "Embroidery" is good, but now I am speaking "in Code."

We had the pleasure of being shown through the office by one of the chiefs of the staff who explained to us untinglingly, making a complex subject as simple as could be to our density.

There are so many beautiful and valuable instruments together with batteries innumerable which made it a most interesting place to visit.

cannot but envy a man's position there and had I belonged to the genus homo would have asked for a "job."

The mess room, billiard room, library of the quarters are all in keeping with the rest of the surroundings.

Guysboro about 30 miles distant from Canso is conceded by every one who has ever visited it an extremely pretty little spot. It is 15 miles in breadth from Fox Island to the southern end of the Gut of Canso.

Unlike Canso it has a fine agricultural country surrounding it which together with its fisheries make the good things of life easily accessible. Entering the harbor it is extremely pretty. I might mention did space permit The Inter vale Coal Harbor, Whitehead etc all places of more or less interest. Guysboro has also much historic interest; deeds of Indian scalping parties; the capture by French forces and then vauding by privateers. Our experience of the place was being most delightfully entertained by charming people, taken for a lovely drive and afterwards going boating on the placid waters of Guysboro harbor.

Two of the steamers on which we took passage are deserving of passing note. Of course everyone who has boarded the "Halifax" of the S. S. Plant Line will tell the same story, viz., the kindness and politeness of her officers, and the extreme cleanliness of her state rooms.

But a boat of smaller pretensions the "Margaret" belonging to the Halifax Canso S. S. Co. might be mentioned en passant a neat trim little steamer commanded by a captain who is the very personification of kindness. Anyone travelling on his boat receives more than the usual attention and the universal opinion is that he is a "good sort!"

The chief engineer is a striking figure of herculean size standing 6 feet 7 1/2. What a splendid soldier he would make And now I have come to the end of my story as we leave for the return trip to P. E. I. in the morning.

## COATES WINS CHAMPIONSHIP

### Dartmouth Man Still Champion Sculler of St. John Harbor.

ST. JOHN, September 19.—W. J. Coates of the Neptunes, retained the St. John harbor sculling championship by defeating James Ross recently over the harbor course. A big crowd saw the race. Ross led down the course and turned first, but Coates caught him soon after. Coached by Hilton Belyea, whose suspension by the M. P. A. A. prevented him entering the race, but who was out in his shell, Ross spurted and closed some of the gap, but Coates won by a length and a half. No official time was taken.

## NEW REGIMENT OF LIFE GUARDS

ST. PETERSBURG, S. P. 18.—For the further protection of his own person, Emperor Nicholas has ordered the creation of a new regiment of Life Guards, composed of specially selected officers, non-commissioned officers and soldiers, drawn from regiments throughout the entire Russian army, on the personal recommendation of the commanders of the various corps, who are to be held strictly responsible for the good behavior of their appointees.

The members of this new regiment will be chosen individually, will be required to have manifested exceptional trustworthiness and devotion to the throne, and will be placed under the orders of the commander of the Imperial Palace.

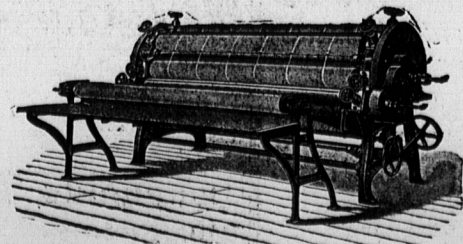

### Synopsis of Canadian North-West HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

ANY even numbered section of Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 28, (not) reserved may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any one over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section (40 acres, more or less).

Entry must be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land is situated.

The homesteader is required to perform conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans:

(1) At least six months residence upon an 80 acre section of the land in each year for three years.

(2) If the father or mother, if the father deceased of the homesteader resides upon 50 acres in the vicinity of the land entered the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If the father has his permanent residence upon the farm and owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by residing upon the said land.

Six months' notice in writing shall be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Land, Ottawa of intention to apply for patent.
