It pays to buy in this Province.

By a telegram that has been received it is learned that the schooner owned by Duncan McMillan, Cymbric, arrived in North Sydney on Thursday Nov. 9th. Mr. McMillan was on board and left Rustico Harbor Wednesday the 8th with a cargo of produce.

The handsome trophy won by Thomas Oulton in the twenty mile bicycle road race in St. John is on exhibition in the window of C. L. Martin, Church Street. The cup is a beauty and Mr. Oulton is to be congratulated upon smashing another Maritime record.—Amherst Exc. (This refers to the trophy held last year by Nelson, Winchester of this city.)

The services in connection with the anniversary of the Carleton Methodist church were concluded last evening with the annual service of the Women's Missionary Society of the church. Addresses were given by Mrs. Sanford and Rev. H. E. Thomas. Miss Long sang a solo and Rev. Mr. and Mrs. Thomas, a duet. At the close of the service refreshments were served.—St. John Exc. (Rev. Mr. and Mrs. Thomas are former residents of this city.)

An investigation into the cause of the stranding of the steamer Electra on the Cape Breton Coast last month was opened by Captain Luger Wednesday morning. Captain Beattie of Pictou who was in command at the time of the stranding gave evidence. The engineer and mate are to give evidence before the hearing closes. It was first intended to hold the investigation at Pictou but arrangements could not be made.—Halifax Exc. (The Electra plied between P. E. I. ports and the mainland.)

Speaking of H. Price Webber, the well known theatrical manager, a Montreal exchange says:—"Mr. Webber has made a new high record of 53 weeks on the road without missing a single night. During this time he has covered the States of Maine, New Hampshire and Vermont, parts of Massachusetts and New York, and the Canadian provinces of Quebec, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, and so far part of New Brunswick. The general Webber has a host of personal friends in Moncton, and as ever has a pleasant word for all and at the same time a keen eye for business. Mr. Webber played in this city recently.

Referring to the poultry market in Moncton, The Star says:—"Prices on turkeys are easier today, and are likely to be much lower within the next week or ten days. Advices from the country say that the supplies are larger than a year ago, and that buyers to supply their wants at 17c. per lb., a 3c. decline from present quotations. The demand from the American buyers has fallen off and is not nearly so heavy as a year ago. With the easier tendency of prices on spot, the demand will increase and the trade will become active. Turkey, lb., 18c. to 20c.; Chickens, lb., 13c. to 15c.; Fowls, lb., 10c. to 12c.; Ducks, lb., 15c. to 17c.; Geese, lb., 13c. to 14c.

Referring to Canada's great resources in the way of water power an exchange notes that Hon. Clifford Sifton, chairman of the Conservation Commission, has stated that Canada possesses nearly one-half the total available water power of the globe—that is the fresh water power. Very little so far has been done towards harnessing the tides, though in France a number of hydraulic plants operated by the tides seem to give satisfactory results. In Canada generally the importance of water power is now very generally appreciated. An illustration of this may be found in the fact that the power projects developed in Canada represent a capital investment of \$198,641,800 and a capacity in horse power of 2,068,650. Prince Edward Island is allotted a Capital investment of \$10,000 and a horse power of 44. Speaking generally the exchange says, "Electrical power is rapidly superseding steam power in manufacturing industries and the province or district which develops its water powers on the most up-to-date system will have great advantage in the struggle for manufacturing supremacy. There are only two great natural sources of energy—heat as represented by the energy of the sun stored up in combustible material, such as coal, peat and wood, and the energy available in the waters of the rivers and streams. Canada is comparatively rich in fuel, but it is superlatively rich in water power scattered broadcast and in almost unlimited amounts throughout every province."
