UNCLE SAM'S NEW ISLANDS.

Clustering near the eastern end of Porto Rico are three small islands that have long belonged to Denmark, which it is now believed have been or are about to be acquired by the United States. These islands are small in area and population. Santa Cruz, or St. Croix is the largest of these and has 84 square miles with a population of about 20,000. St. Thomas is 32 miles in area and has about 12,000 people. St. John has 21 square miles and about 1,000 souls.

Denmark has little use for these possessions as the cost of maintaining her Government there has exceeded the income and has been willing to sell out her sovereignty. As a matter of fact an agreement was made years ago for the sale of St. Thomas to the United States but the U. S. Senate refused to ratify the agreement. This refusal was afterward deeply regretted when the Spanish war came on as the Island has a famous harbor which would form a fine base for naval operations. Since Porto Rico has fallen to the United States it has seemed again desirable to negotiate for the little Danish Islands, lest perchance they might fall into other hands.

The price of the three Islands is said to be some four or five million dollars, which is a mere bagatelle for the rich Republic to pay, although a large sum for the small area of territory involved. The island people, will probably not be unwilling to change their allegiance as their freedom will be secure and they will gain free access to the United States markets.

NEW RAILS FOR THE INTERCOLONIAL

MONTREAL, September 7.—Manager Russell, of the Intercolonial railway, was here to-day en route to Buffalo. He stated that within three years the whole main line of the Intercolonial, Montreal, Halifax and Sydney, will be laid with one hundred and eighty pound rails; Fifteen thousand of those rails have been purchased in England to lay the eastern extension, Mr. Clergue not being able to live up to his contract.

GREAT COMBINE

PITTSBURG, Pa., September 6.—The Post says the bituminous coal mining companies in Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, West Virginia and Kentucky, are to be consolidated into one great corporation by the J. P. Morgan syndicate.

The completion of this great project will mean the consolidation of from \$200,000,000 to \$300,000,000 of invested capital.


