In view of the fact that the people of Summerside have not been offered the same opportunities that have been afforded the people of this City to subscribe to the Monument Fund, and believing that with their usual liberality the people of Western Capital would desire to assist in this provincial work, it has been decided that a deputation be sent thither in the interest of the fund. The deputation will consist of Judge Warburton, Mr. Patrick Blake and Lieut. Col. Moore, who will leave this morning for Summerside. We trust they may be successful in securing a liberal addition to the amount already subscribed.

The long summer of 1901 in Prince Edward Island will probably be remembered for a generation to come. Here we are with one third of November already gone and the weather still preserving the calm, sunshiny aspect which has marked the season since May last. It will be easy to remember that it was in the first of the century and the first year of King Edward's reign that we enjoyed the long summer, with the harvest all over in August and that followed by two and a half months of almost summer weather. From England comes tidings of dreary fogs and London in the day time enveloped in the darkness of Egypt, while we have enjoyed month after month of bright sunshine, free from the chill and driving rains which sometimes render the Canadian autumn unpleasant.

The British Government has acquired 180,000 acres of land in South Africa for the purpose of establishing breeding farms, and one fortieth part of the tract will be for a forest reserve. At present there is scarcely a fair sized tree between the Cape and Pretoria. At present the farmers have to quarry pillars of stone at great expense to use as fence posts for the interminable wire fences which enclose their farms of from five to ten thousand acres. Manure is used as fuel and all furniture has to be imported. Forests are needed not only to supply wood and fuel, but to hold the rain when it comes in abundance and prevent it running off in a rush as is now the case. What Britain has done for Egypt and India in afforestation and vast works of irrigation is an indication of what South Africa needs and an effort is apparently to be made to supply the great want.

Senator Ellis, the Editor in Chief of the St. John Globe will be grieved to learn from Editor Nash of the Patriot that the Globe is "notorious for being incorrect and much given to unpardonable blunders." This arises from the Globe having spoken of "Mr. McLeod, now Attorney General of P. E. Island." Whether this was done from inadvertence or in mild sarcasm, we do not know. At a distance of 150 miles there may be many intelligent persons who do not know who is the Editor of the Patriot, much less the name of a comparatively recent Attorney General.

The King's title is at length definitely settled. It runs thus: "Edward the Seventh, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the sea, King Defender of the Faith and Emperor of India." It will be remembered that the question was submitted to the Canadian and other colonial Governments in January last and suggestions invited as to the style in which the outlying portions of the Empire should be briefly described. Mr. Chamberlain had proposed in part the words, "King of Great Britain and Ireland and of Greater Britain beyond the Seas." The Canadian Privy Council took exception to the phrase Greater Britain as not definite enough and proposed that the colonial part of the title should be "King of Canada, Australasia South Africa and all the British Dominions beyond the Seas." As an alternate to this our Privy Council proposed the words, King of all the British Dominions beyond the Seas." This alternate proposal has been substantially accepted, and the King's title stands as proposed in Canada's second choice of terms.

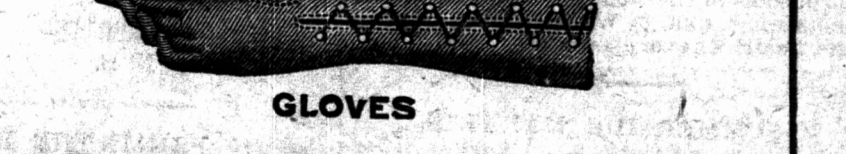

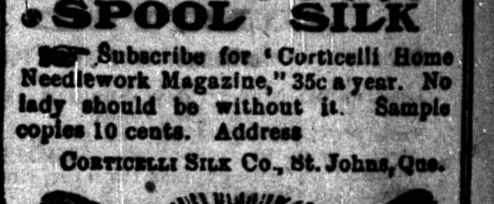
