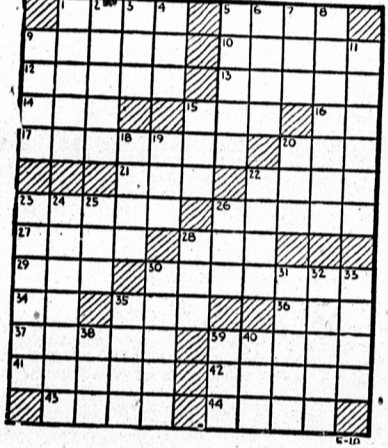

After West's heart opening, declarer could have taken eight tricks, going down only 800 points, but he slipped a little and actually paid a penalty of 1100.
This did not compare very favorably with the five-odd that South could have made at a spade contract, regardless of the defense.
The fault for landing in a very bad spot was largely North's, but South himself had a finger in the pie. North's rescue of the doubled four-spade bid was nothing less than atrocious. He had already warned South, by bidding two clubs directly over the double of one spade, that he could not stand a spade contract; when South, in the face of that warning, bid all the way up to four spades by himself, it was up to
