MANY HAD HALF DOLLARS CIRCULATED IN THE EAST
WASHINGTON, Dec. 29.—There has been a remarkable activity by small coin counterfeiters during the last few weeks, which is attributed by secret service officials to the rush of Christmas season, when offenders expected to pass spurious money on the hurrying public. Most of the counterfeiters were half dollars, circulated in the east.
The arrest in New York on Christmas eve of Louis Julien charged with making and circulating bad money, makes the fourth recent arrest of the kind. Reports to the secret service here state that 21 counterfeit halves and a complete counterfeiting outfit, including molds for dollars, halves and quarters, were captured with Julien.

FLOCK STANDS BY PASTOR SHOPLIFTER

SPRINGFIELD, Dec. 27.—The members of the First Methodist Church of Westfield are to-day awaiting the return of Rev. Conrad Hooker, their pastor, who went to Welland, Ont., after he was detained by the police of this city on a charge of shoplifting. The minister is due home this evening to continue his duties.
The clergyman's flock—seven hundred in number—declare that they will stand by Dr. Hooker and are awaiting to tell him so. Resentment is expressed against the Springfield police for calling Dr. Hooker "a common thief." Meanwhile, the police stand pat.

In the crowded stores, they assert, his mind became a blank and his mental aberration took the form of an irresponsible, irresistible impulse to take articles which appealed to his fancy.
