At a regular quarterly meeting of the Alberton Merchants Board of Trade held in the office of James E. Birch yesterday afternoon a resolution was passed protesting against the advance rates of G. T. R. and C. P. R. truckmen of 1 1/2 and 2 cents per 100 lbs on goods trucked from depots. The much needed improvements in the Alberton harbor were also discussed and the secretary was authorized to write the authorities again with reference to dredging about the wharves and improvements to outside harbor. The President was instructed to prepare a sheet showing the authorities where the railway tariff discriminates against the Island to the tune of 2 to 4 cents per hundred pounds. The meeting was well attended and the president A. J. McFadyen occupied the chair.

Mr. Smith (Hampton) continued the debate and spoke well on the various subjects under discussion. His speech was a valuable defence of the Government's policy and he told of the benefit derived from the Department of Agriculture. The Seed Fairs were doing inestimable good, and the encouragement of dairying and beef-raising were matters that were receiving attention. The latter especially was something which could be followed with undoubted success by farmers in this Province. Mr. Smith held the undivided attention of the House.

Mr. Morson followed, and took up the Prince County Jail contract recounting the details thereof at length. He was replied to by Hon. Mr. Clark, and the subject was continued by the Leader of the Opposition.

House adjourned shortly after 11 p. m.

BAD SOLDIERS WERE DEGRADED

BUCHAREST, April 7.—The wholesale degradation of sixty infantrymen, including some non-commissioned officers, has taken place on the drill grounds of the regiment before deputation from every military body in the garrison. The sixty men were found guilty by a military court "of the grossest breach of discipline in the code," namely of refusing to obey a command to fire upon the people of the village of Stanesti, who had risen in revolt against the royal authorities.

The villagers happened to belong to the same tribe of Roumanians as the majority of the soldiers. Besides some of the soldiers had relatives, or friends, in the village. Hence, when a lieutenant, commanding the troop of infantry, ordered his men to fire into the crowd, they absolutely refused, throwing down their arms and defying their superior.

The officer then ordered his men to charge and when they refused he galloped single handed against the enemy he was quickly surrounded, torn from his horse and slain, after he had wounded a number of the rioters. For their breach of discipline and for allowing their officer to be killed the court martial decreed degradation and life long imprisonment in the royal salt mines.

FIRST COINS FROM CANADIAN MINT

It Can Now Be Truly Said That Canada is Making Money

OTTAWA, April 7.—The first shipment of silver coin was made from the Canadian Royal Mint Thursday afternoon, a total of \$24,000 being sent to various parts of the country.

The coins were of all denominations, and an equal quantity, so far as value was concerned, of each class was sent out. There were 12,000 50-cent pieces, 24,000 25-cent pieces, 60,000 10-cent pieces, and 120,000 5-cent pieces, making \$6,000 worth of each denomination.

The money was shipped to the Receiver-General in Toronto, Montreal, Vancouver and other cities, who will deal the coins out as they are applied for.

Shipments of silver will be made regularly, according as the supply sent out now is exhausted. There will be no gold sent out for some time, as the refiners have not yet arrived.
