The Pacific Presbyterian of San Francisco has the following of a well known Charlottetown man:—Sunday Nov. 29th, was a "red letter day" in the missionary contributions of the Santa Clara church. After an earnest appeal by our pastor, Rev. J. M. Innis, in which he presented not the duty but the privilege we have of contributing to the work of the Lord, the annual home missionary offering was taken, amounting to \$82.40, the largest in the history of the church. But this magnificent offering for the work at home, was only surpassed by a greater one for foreign missions. At the close of the service a letter was read from Dr. Andrew Beattie of the Canton Mission, asking for five hundred dollars (\$500) for the purpose of erecting a chapel at Tsang Shing, China, and before the day closed \$425 had been contributed for the erection of a house of worship in Tsang Shing. This is simply one indication of the impetus the work in Santa Clara has experienced under the consecrated efforts of Rev. MacInnis.

AN ELOQUENT SERMON LAST NIGHT BY REV. T. F. FULLERTON

The Doctrine of Retribution—The Material Hell of Old Bellef Discarded, but Punishment Must Last While Sin Exists.

St. James' Church was filled last night notwithstanding the disagreeable weather, to hear Rev. Mr. Fullerton in the concluding sermon of a series speak on Hell. The Reverend gentleman took for his text Rev. 1, 18. "A marked change has," he said, "come in the preaching of the Gospel in regard to the doctrine of retribution. We no longer hear of a material hell—the hell of the mediaeval ages. True some preachers hold out such a figure as a lash with which to whip souls into the Kingdom but we have reached a higher plane of intelligence. We cannot think of a loving God being filled with hatred or vindictiveness."

It is now almost universally believed that time is part of eternity. This world is heaven or hell as we make it such. On the one hand we have seen the godly on the brink of the unknown looking forward with a blissful spirit to their entrance into the future. On the other hand we have seen the wicked at the portals of the unknown filled with trepidation. If the future is a part of the present, sins that are not punished here must be hereafter. By divine law sin must have its reward. Give sin rein in the individual life and it will make a hell of life just as severe as it can or will be hereafter. The laws of health cannot be violated with impunity and as the future is bound up with the present the sinful life cannot evade retribution. Hell then is the natural result of wickedness; it is the gnawing torment, the outcome of our deeds from which, if we remain imper-
