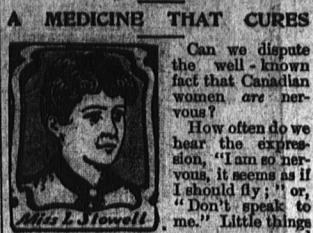

Scotchmen Find it Hard to Obtain Employment Near Their Own Homes—The Underground Telegraph Service

GLASGOW, March 18.—One of the most menacing forms of alien immigration is little known outside Lanarkshire and Ayrshire. The invasion of the coal mines by Lithuanian and Polish colliers—they are known indiscriminately as John Poles, in Scotland—began about ten years ago, and is growing every month, and although the native miner may seek work for weeks it is stated that John Poles are a job within twelve hours of his disembarkation.

WORLD'S BUTTER RECORD BROKEN

DETROIT, March 18.—At Fond Du Lac, Wisconsin, in a 60 day test, a cow owned by W. J. Gillett, has broken the world's butter record by forty pounds. The official test, shows 5,856.70 pounds of milk and 290.5 pounds of butter. The cow gave birth to the calf Dec. 19, and the test was commenced on the fifth day of her period of lactation. The test was continued for sixty-four days, during which period every milking was watched, the quantity of milk weighed and samples taken for the test. The phenomenal yield was such that two separate tests were ordered the first of 24 hours, and the second 48 hours and during which time additional representatives were sent from the expert station. The cow was under supervision day and night. The best day in milk was 100 pounds. The best day in butter, 574 pounds.

TRAIN RAN IN TWO FEET WATER

CHICAGO, March 18.—Thirty-four passengers on the Pennsylvania eighteenth hour reached Chicago nine hours late yesterday after varied experiences, including a rebate of \$5 each from the railroad company for its inability to make its schedule. The train came over the Panhandle route from Pittsburg. Its troubles began sixty miles east of Pittsburg where a freight wreck was encountered. It reached Pittsburg in the midst of rising waters. Ten miles west of Pittsburg it ran through water eighteen inches deep. Ahead was a stretch of five miles of deeper water which was rising rapidly. A second engine was called for and the train pulled back to Pittsburg through twenty-six inches of water.

Early in the morning the train started for Chicago over the Panhandle route.
