IN MEMORIAM

KENNETH H. GORDON The death occurred recently in Oakland, California, of Mr. Kenneth Henderson Gordon, a native of Brudenell River, P. E. I., and a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. John A. Gordon. He is a direct descendant of the original Donald Gordon, pioneer of the well known Brudenell settlement established in 1800, with James MacLaren of Perth, Scotland. On his maternal side he is a grandson of the late Major the Hon. Kenneth Henderson Gordon, former doctor, soldier and member of the Legislative Council of Prince Edward Island before the turn of the century. His father was a colorful merchant mariner, who, like many Prince Edward Islanders, sailed the seven seas on ships built and manned by Islanders. Seven Gordons, all cousins, or brothers, became captains. The late Mr. Gordon was active in engineering work all his life. Starting out as a junior member of the surveying crew, which laid the Murray Harbour Railroad branch, he was later with the advance surveying party that detailed the ground work for the then unexplored sections of Northern Ontario. Later Mr. Gordon was Supt. of Underground for the City of Calgary, Alberta, being responsible for transferring the conduit system underground and for the establishment and development of Calgary's well known recreational center, Bowness Park. As a resident of California, he renewed many friendships, and Oakland was a mecca for "Islanders", many of whom are well known in their adopted community. At the time of his death, the late Mr. Gordon was a member of the Trowel Club of Oakland (Masonic) and of the various social activities in connection with his work in labour and welfare organizations. His funeral, held on his sixty-sixth birthday, was largely attended in the beautiful Chapel of the Chimes, Piedmont Ave., Oakland, under the direction of Mr. Samuel Worswick, Secretary manager of the East Bay (California) Masonic Service. A record of the service was sent to members of St. George's Lodge, No. 4, F. and A.M. of which the deceased brother, D. M. Gordon, of Brudenell River, is a Past Master. He is survived by his widow, three brothers, Douglas M., Seymour and Harold, and one sister, Mrs. W. Dewar. Over forty-five floral tributes and countless telegrams from all over the United States and Canada were received by his chief mourners, among whom were his wife, Mrs. Helen MacLaren Gordon, and his two brothers-in-law, W. G. MacLaren of Vancouver, B.C., and Burton MacLaren of Los Angeles, California, both being present for the last rites. His younger brother, Harold R. M. Gordon also flew from New York to attend the services and represent his family.
