THE Ex-chequer court cases.—L. A. Audett, Esquire, Registrar of the Ex-chequer Court of Canada, was yesterday engaged auditing the bills of costs rendered by the defendants' attorneys at the recent Ex-chequer Court cases regarding the Belfast Branch Railway. Mr. Audette commenced his work in the Law Library at ten o'clock yesterday morning and finished about ten o'clock last night and disposed of about a dozen bills of costs in all.

THE ONLY SURVIVOR.

Mr. George Croal, of Edinburgh, is probably the only survivor of the large assembly which, in 1823, at the Edinburgh Theatre Royal dinner, heard Sir Walter Scott acknowledge his authorship of the Waverley novels. Mr. Croal, who is in his ninety-first year, still walks about Edinburgh, and his recollections are vivid.

SUING FOR MAGNETIC HEALING.

Trial of the suit of Dr. Emma Warne for \$100,000 from the estate of Francis T. Wheeler, a millionaire, for medical services, has begun in the Probate Court, Chicago. Mr. Wheeler was suffering from acute gastritis, and Dr. Warne treated him for five years by the magnetic healing system, which consists of the laying on of the hands. Dr. Warne testified Thursday that such treatment is very exacting on the healer and often leads to death. She said she frequently had a nervous collapse after it.

TO BUILD AN AIR SHIP.

In Windsor Park, Chicago, a company of Pittsburg men, headed by John Allen are building an air ship. Those interested in the scheme talk enthusiastically among themselves, but reluctantly to outsiders. Allen, the inventor, arrives at the workshop at 8 o'clock in the evening. The part of the airship which is expected to cause it to rise is shaped like a fish.

TESTING OF DIFFERENT ROADS.

Hamilton, Ont., Spectator: Comparing tar macadam roadways with those constructed out of asphalt the test in Hamilton gives the preference to the use of tar. The city pays its workmen engaged in tar macadam road-making higher wages than are paid elsewhere for laborers, work and yet the cost in constructing the road is kept well under 90 cents per square yard.
