Murder Is Swim Verdict

WOODSTOCK, N. B., March 30—That Harvey Trenholm and his wife Olive came to their deaths from revolver shots fired by Ben-ny Swim was the verdict of the Coroner's Jury yesterday afternoon at the inquest into the double killing at Benton Ridge on Monday last.

Doctor A Suicide

TRURO, Mar. 30—That he shot and killed himself while suffering from melancholia was the verdict of the Coroner's Jury which en-quired into the circumstances of the death of Dr. M. K. Langille, well known dentist who was found dead in his home here with gun shot wounds in the face. Dr. Langille was 65 years of age and leaves a widow, one son and one daughter.

Saved Professor, But Loses Life

BERLIN, March 29—An attempt was made to assassinate Professor Paul N. Milukoff, former minister of foreign affairs in the Russian provisional government, while he was addressing a gathering of Russians tonight. The attempt was frustrated by Vladimir Nubokoff, who himself was killed by a bullet aimed at Milukoff.

LONDON, March 30—A report has been in circulation that Lord Carson was expected to resign as a result of the attack made on him in the House of Lords yesterday by Lord Birkenhead.

Lord Carson, however, in an interview this morning, said he knew nothing whatever about it. He said he had not even seen Lord Birkenhead's speech yet.

Lloyd George and Churchill Agree

LONDON, March 29—The differences between Premier Lloyd George and Winter Spence, Churchill, secretary for the colonies, respecting the recognition of the Bolshevik government, are reported to have been composed at a conference between them last night and at the cabinet council today. The resolution which the premier will move in the House of Commons next Monday regarding Genoa has been agreed upon and will be announced tomorrow.

The cabinet is said to be united upon the policy which Mr. Lloyd George will outline in his speech to the Liberal colleagues in the government, including the whips and the under-secretaries and outlined to them the present intentions.

Afterwards Mr. Lloyd George had an audience with King George, giving the monarch his customary review of recent political developments. Tonight the premier left for Quebec, where he will spend the remainder of the week.
