## THE MYSTERY OF STONEHENGE

BOSTON, Mass., June 26—Prof. R. Morton, of Harvard, according to reports that reached here from Cyrenia, Crete, Libya, has made discoveries that may solve the mystery of Stonehenge, the ruins on Salisbury Plain which marks the earliest vestige of English civilization. Prof. Morton, it is said, will soon announce the result of the excavation by an archaeological expedition of the Greek city Cyrene which was founded B. C. 631. The connection between the discoveries at Cyrene and Stonehenge is said to lie in the similarity of the great stone columns common to each. The resemblance between the Grecian and Ancient British Monoliths is said to be very striking.

## "A NIGHT WITH DICKENS"

At People's Theatre To-Night. A Tale of Two Cities

A Vitagraph Life Portrayal in three parts from the novel of "Chas Dickens"—deals with the history of the latter part of the eighteenth century in France. The first piece opens with the arrest of Dr Manette, a celebrated physician of Paris, his incarceration in the Bastille—and his consequent sufferings in the dark and dismal dungeon. The second part of the tale introduces some astonishing denouements and some very attractive and remarkable characters, at the time of Dr Manette's arrest, eighteen years previous to the events portrayed in this reel. Lucy the daughter of the Doctor, was an infant—who was taken to London by De Farge, the Doctor's faithful servant, and placed with the Doctor's estate under the guardianship of Tillson's Bank. She is now grown to womanhood, and believes her father dead, but learns he is still alive and safe under the care of De Farge in Paris. Lucy hastens to Paris with Mr. Lorry who is a parent to her, finds her father, but it is some time before his mind is sufficiently restored to recall the child—Partially restored he returns to London with his daughter and Mr. Lorry. On the way across Lucy meets on board-ship a nephew of Marquis Evermond Chas Darney who has denounced his uncle and espoused the cause of the people. He falls in love with Lucy, and later marries her. At this point the hero of the tale appears prominently before the onlooker, Sidney Carton, a young attorney in Tillson's Bank. He idolizes Lucy for the purity of soul and lovable disposition, his one ambition being to prove himself worthy of her esteem by some act in her behalf. His opportunity comes, when he substitutes himself for Darney—who has been arrested in London as a spy and again in the third reel—when Darney returns to France where the revolution is at its worst. Darney is arrested as an assistant—and freed through the efforts of Dr. Manette who followed his son-in-law from London. He is no sooner released and restored to his anxious wife—when he is arrested as a relative of Marquis Evermond—and condemned to death. Carton at this time appears, bribes the jailer, gains admission to his friends cell—reminds him of their resemblance—and pleads for the sake of Lucy to change clothes with him—and allow him to take his place. Darny refuses—but Carton applies chloroform—with which he had provided himself, to the condemned man's nostrils—changes clothes—calls the jailer who carries Darny to the carriage in which Carton arrived at the jail—and soon the young nobleman is on his way to London while Sidney Carton with a smile of satisfaction on his face is led to the guillotine amid the shouts of the mentioned crowd, crowning his indifferent life with the noblest act within the power of man for a greater love than this hath no man—to give his life for his friend. The grandeur of this closing scene where Carton in the trumbrel cart comforts the poor little seamstress on the way with him to their execution reaches at climax of intensity and tremulous response; it fills us with higher motives and higher aspirations that lifts us out of ourselves into a world of better thoughts. This will be repeated tomorrow night with an additional film which will send you away smiling. Admission, the same little price—to all—so come early.
