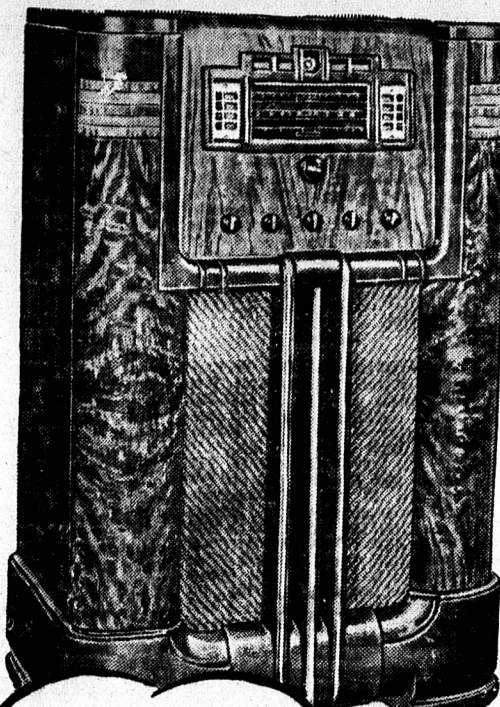

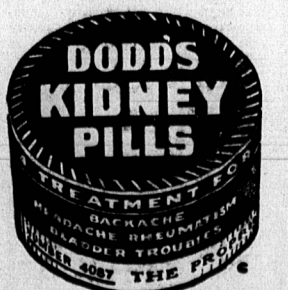
Annual Tuberculosis Christmas Seal Sale

Those for the citizens of Charlottetown, Wednesday, November 24. The members of the Gyro Club will begin personal solicitation of Business Firms in the City today. By having your contribution ready for the Gyros, second calls will be avoided and much of your time and theirs saved. Those receiving seals in the mail are requested to mail their contributions in the enclosed stamped and addressed envelope. Prompt returns will be greatly appreciated. British Guiana Buys R. O. P. Cockerels

Further evidence of the wide recognition of the value of Canadian Record of Performance poultry has just been received in the form of an order for breeding stock from the Director of Agriculture for British Guiana. This shipment has a total value of \$170 at the farm of origin. CAREFUL SEWERS SELECT THEIR THREAD IN RIGHT "NUMBERS" If a woman is well-groomed, and always meticulous, it is because she has given careful preparation to her wardrobe. If she makes her own clothes, she has carefully selected all her most becoming materials and pattern types, and has put into her costumes the little touches that mean so much in fashion importance. She never depends on "accident." Even threads receive their proper attention by the woman who makes her own clothes in the professional manner. She selects the threads put out by the best known makers, because she knows they will be even and stronger. She prefers a good six-cord thread. If she is using colored materials she buys a ballfast thread, and always a shade darker than the fabric. Sizes are very important. For coarse sewing, she will use size 20-30; for general, all-around uses, 50 or 60; and for fine sewing, 80 or 90.
