#### SUFFRAGETTES SCOLDED.

CHICAGO, Feb. 20.—Criticism of the belligerent attitude of English suffragettes in their campaign to obtain votes for women, is expressed in resolutions signed by nearly one hundred of the leading women of the Abraham Lincoln Center, one of the leading institutional churches of this city and forwarded today to Lady Emily Pankhurst in London. The resolution reads as follows:— "We, workers of the Abraham Lincoln Center and friends of women suffrage earnestly deplore the belligerence, we fear, are menacing the cause dear to them and to us. The appeal should be to reason and not to arms. There is a notoriety that is not notable. Militancy belongs to the past, of passing regime that is masculine. The appeal to reason, the arguments of love alone will hasten the coming of the government based on the hearthstone, not on the bayonet. The family and not the regiment, is the unit of government that women are to help establish."

Attached to the resolution was a letter from Rev. Jenkin Lloyd Jones, head resident of the Abraham Lincoln Center, reading in part:—"I believe that the signers of this resolution are not wanting in courage or conviction, but they believe that there is imminent danger under what is doubtless great provocation, of urging one important principle by means that menace is still more important principle than upon which ordered society and legalized government exists."

#### DOES NOT NEED A MEMORIAL.

LONDON, Feb. 20.—King George has subscribed £200, Queen Mary £100, Queen Alexandra £100, ex-King Manuel of Portugal £25 and Lord Curzon £100 to the Mansion House Scott fund. The total of all the funds is now £20,000. Lord Rosebery, who also contributed £100 to the fund for the benefit of the dependant on Scott and his comrades, in the course of a speech last night said:—"People who live after their death need no memorial. Froisher, one of the greatest and most strenuous of the Elizabethan seadogs, does not need a memorial. The men whose bones have just been found in the icy regions opposite those which Froisher tried to explore, need no memorial put up by a county council or any other authority."

The appeal of Captain Scott will be as lasting a memorial for all posterity as any work of art, as any statue, as any immortal book that was ever written."

As a result of a meeting of the Mansion House committee and British Antarctic expedition committee, it has been unanimously resolved to amalgamate the funds. This was done so as to promote unity in the receipt of contributions for the purpose and their subsequent allocation. It is hoped that the newspaper funds will be merged into this and administered by a central committee.

#### PASTOR REFUSES CALL.

TORONTO, Feb. 20.—To the great satisfaction of the Bloor Street Baptists, the pastor of the church, Rev. W. A. Cameron, has declined a tempting offer made him by the congregation of Calvary Baptist Church, New York.

The New York church offered Mr. Cameron \$12,000 a year, a secretary, an assistant pastor and a permanent organization of church workers. At Bloor Street he is receiving \$3,000 yearly, and there is an assistant and a lady worker.

#### UNCLE SAM PLEASED, BUT WATCHFUL.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 19.—Although its plans remained set for action in case of emergency, the United States today was distinctly relieved at the over-night news from Mexico telling of the abdication of President Madero and the apparent settlement of the dock and its people are proud of him.

Preparations for eventualities, however, were not relaxed. It was recognized that readjustment in the government was filled with danger, and no orders were issued which would halt the movement already begun. Gathered under the avowed declaration that they were to be mobilized for practice with the Atlantic fleet at Guantanamo, Cuba, 2,000 marines will be despatched to that port as originally ordered unless there is a good reason for their recall. Such orders were not apparent today. The navy department also denied that it had issued orders in any way setting aside the original plan of action. Officials feel that the United States government has been at least temporarily released from a difficult diplomatic situation.

#### ENGLAND AND GERMANY.

BERLIN, Feb. 19.—The official minutes of the Reichstag committee before which Von Tirpitz, minister of marine, made a statement in regard to naval increases, show that the assumption of the newspapers in England and Germany that it meant that some sort of an agreement had been reached between the two countries in regard to a reduction of their programs was unwarranted. No agreement has been reached nor are negotiations going on for a reduction of the naval program. The minutes show that the statement of Admiral Von Tirpitz was merely a recognition of facts as to the naval strength of Germany and Great Britain, coupled with an int-
