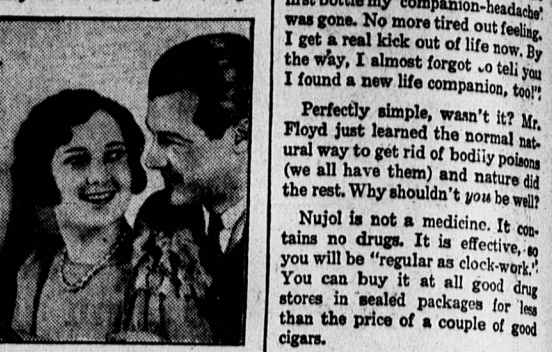

ISLAND NURSE SEEKS TO SAVE LIFE OF PATIENT (The Leader, Chester, New Hampshire.)

In order to save the life of her patient, Mrs. Hilda B. Campbell, 37 of Candia, a nurse gave a quart of her blood, and today the patient, Mrs. Paul Holt, of Nashua, although still in a serious condition is expected to recover. The blood transfusion took place at the Elliot Hospital last Saturday afternoon. Mrs. Holt who had been at the hospital since Sept. 20, was sinking rapidly and the only hope of saving her life was through a blood transfusion.

Mrs. Campbell who had been nursing Mrs. Holt volunteered and although the loss of a quart of blood was a tax to her strength the nurse without hesitating submitted to the transfusion. Although still weak as a result of the transfusion Mrs. Campbell is able to work a few hours a day at her profession. Mrs. Campbell obtained her training at the Lynn Hospital. After graduating from Lynn she went back to her native home in Beverly, Mass., but later went to New York where she followed her profession for several years. She now maintains the lying in Hospital at Candia. (The nurse referred to in the above is a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James Musick, of Chester, N. H., formerly of Prince Edward Island, where Mrs. Campbell was born. She is a niece of Mrs. Archibald Barrett, Wheatley River, and Mrs. Robert Enman, Pownal, P. E. I.)
