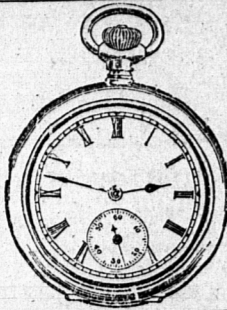

COLD WAVE CAUSES DEATH IN MONTREAL

MONTREAL, Que., Jan. 6.—With one death and scores of frost bites treated at the city hospitals to mark its advent, a bitter cold wave, which hurried temperatures down twenty-five points, within a few hours, swept in from the west last night.

This morning temperatures far below the zero mark, ranging to minus fifteen and twenty, showed the intensity of the winter's initial effort, which marked a drop of over twenty points from yesterday's highest thermometer achievements.

An unidentified man sixty years old found huddled and frozen stiff in the doorway of St. Jean Baptiste Market, furnished the first victim of the wave.

Trains and trolley cars are today finding difficulty in maintaining a schedule on the frost rails.
