J. Chappell and to them was born a family of two sons and three daughters. After many years of joyful and devoted companionship she gave up her dear husband who so long helped her along life's pathway, his going was only made easier for her by the glorious hope of being re-united some glad day. In 1908 Mrs. Chappell gave up a daughter also, and with her and many others of former generations she will at last be united.
