OTTAWA, Ont., April 17.—Can-

ladian egg markets are firm. Washington D. C. government report gives cold storage holdings of eggs on April 1st 857,000 cases as compared with 1,156,000 cases for same date last year. Toronto (firm, wholesale extras 33 to 34, firsts 31 to 32, seconds 27 to 28, some broilers are arriving selling 85c dressed. Montreal receipts light. Winnipeg prices to consumers extras 38, firsts 33, seconds 29. Saskatchewan prices to consumers extras 35, firsts 30 to 35, seconds 25 to 30. Calgary egg receipts slightly heavier local demand light. Vancouver retail extras 33 to 35, firsts 30 to 32, seconds 26. Live poultry (firm and unchanged. Saint John, N. B. egg prices to retailers extras 38, firsts 35, seconds 28. Poultry receipts light fowl 45.
