GENERAL KUROPATKIN AT THE HEAD OF HIS ARMY.

General Alexei Kuropatkin is a general who is commanding a retreating army—one which the officials at St. Petersburg say has been ordered to retreat when he pressed on successfully his past record against the Japs is but by a hair's breadth of his real ability. Kuropatkin has certainly not been brilliant so far, but it is of course possible that in the way when the retreat comes, prove to be a military genius. So far as known, Kuropatkin has been present at no battle between the Japs and the Russians. He has spent his time presumably in building up a Russian army from the hundreds of thousands of reserves which are stated to have been sent to Manchuria from Russia since the warm weather has permitted the movement of troops freely across Siberia. So far Kuropatkin is interesting simply because he commands the Russian armies in the Far East.

Origin of the Paper Collar.

In the early part of the eighteenth century there "flourished" a gentleman of considerable literary ability named Samuel Boyse. He was born at Dublin in 1708, and was educated at the University of Glasgow. In the course of an eccentric and extravagant career, he was often reduced to the last extremity of human wretchedness. An old magazine says that at one time in 1740 "He had not a shirt, a coat, or any kind of apparel to put on; the sheets in which he lay were carried to the pawnbrokers, and he was obliged to be confined to his bed with no other covering than a blanket. Whenever his distresses so pressed as to induce him to dispose of his shirt, he cut some white paper in slips, and in the same manner supplied his neck. In this manner he frequently appeared abroad, with the additional inconvenience of the want of breeches. His poetical pieces, if collected, would make six moderate volumes. He translated a poem from the High Dutch of Van Haren in praise of peace, on the conclusion of that made at Aix la Chapelle; but the poem which procured him the greatest reputation was that on "The City." He was employed as the Poet to translate some of Chaucer's Tales into modern English, for which he was paid at the rate of three-pence a line. His most beautiful poem is, perhaps, "The Recantation." He died in obscure lodgings near Shoe Lane, London, in May, 1749, and the remains of the unfortunate author of "The Tears of the Muses" was buried by the parish authorities. Never was a life spent with less grace than that of Mr. Samuel Boyse, and never were such distinguished abilities given to less purpose."

Sir Archibald Douglas.
Sir Archibald Douglas, who succeeds Sir John Fisher as Commander-in-Chief of the British navy at Portsmouth, is junior in rank to most officers who have been rewarded with what is regarded as the "blue ribbon" of the naval service, but he is in his sixty-third year. No Vice-Admiral has been appointed to the post since 1869. A Canadian by birth and education, he is best known as the head of the mission which went to Japan in 1873 and laid the foundations of the naval organization which has done such remarkable work in the present war. His services include the fighting up the Congo and Gambia in 1860, gunboat duty during the Fenian rising in Canada, and the Soudan campaign of 1884.

Dog Travels 20 Miles to Old Home.
A remarkable instance of a dog's love of home is reported from Cromleigh, Dunblane, Perthshire. A collie dog was given to Mr. Hunter of Herriots Hall, Berwickshire, by his brother-in-law, Mr. Gilholm of Cromleigh, and was sent by train to the borderland. The animal worked among the sheep and then suddenly disappeared. It afterward turned up at its old home, having done the seventy-mile journey in forty hours.—London Telegraph.

Could Not Wed.
Referring to the nineteenth birthday of the Baroness Burdett-Coutts it is recalled that at one time it was curiously reported that the great Duke of Wellington wanted her for a wife. When the report reached the Water-loo hero he made this comment: "I said Miss Angela Burdett-Coutts deserved to be a duchess, not that I would make her one." On hearing what the famous soldier said Miss Burdett-Coutts remarked quietly, "I think His Grace should have said could instead of would."
Too Ready With the Knife.
Sir Frederick Treves, the eminent England surgeon, recently delivered an address in which he took the view that the knife is used too hastily in many cases of appendicitis.
