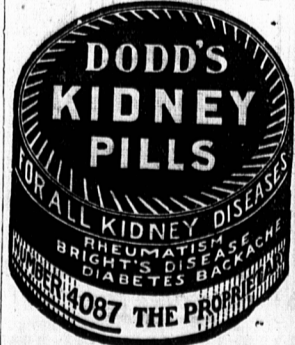
Miss Myrtle Phillips Tyne Valley was a visitor to Summerside on Tuesday, June 1st.
