THE following is taken from the Arizona Range News: The grim reaper of death has gathered his harvest among us with a relentless hand and removed from our midst one of our foremost business men John M. Nicholson. He was taken suddenly ill with pneumonia on Friday, the 4th day of January and died at 2 p. m. January 12th after an illness of eight days. He was attended by his brother Dr. M. J. Nicholson and Dr. Flag of Fort Grant who rendered every medical assistance known to science, and he was nursed by his brother Alexander Nicholson. It was hoped he would pass the crisis of the ninth day, but having suffered for twenty years with a valvular trouble of the heart that organ ultimately gave away causing immediate death. On Monday his remains were shipped to his old home on Prince Edward Island and were accompanied by his brother Alexander Nicholson. Mr. Nicholson was born at Springton near the Straits of Northumberland, Prince Edward Island, Canada, in 1880 and at the time of his demise was 40 years of age. He attended the Prince of Wales College at Charlottetown and was graduated from the advanced teacher's course with high honors. For many years he followed the teaching profession on the Island with brilliant success. Too assiduous application of his chosen profession finally broke down his health and he sought a more genial clime than upon his native Isle with hope of restoration. Arriving in Wilcox he took up the insurance business. Two years later he engaged in the drug business and has been eminently successful. Punctual, sober, honest, upright and industrious and attentive to business he soon gained the confidence of this community, and was rapidly building up a splendid business. No one could associate with him for any length of time without becoming impressed with his sterling qualities of mind and heart. We all sincerely regret the sudden closing of a brilliant career and mourn the loss of a friend and business associate whom we had learned to admire and love. His remains will be laid to rest at Springton Cemetery near the Strait of Northumberland on Prince Edward Island, in the beautiful spot on the far away isle in light of the broad expanse of the restless ocean, he will sleep the long sleep and the hollow sigh of the wind and the melancholy moan of the sea along his native shores, will forever sing dirges to his memory.

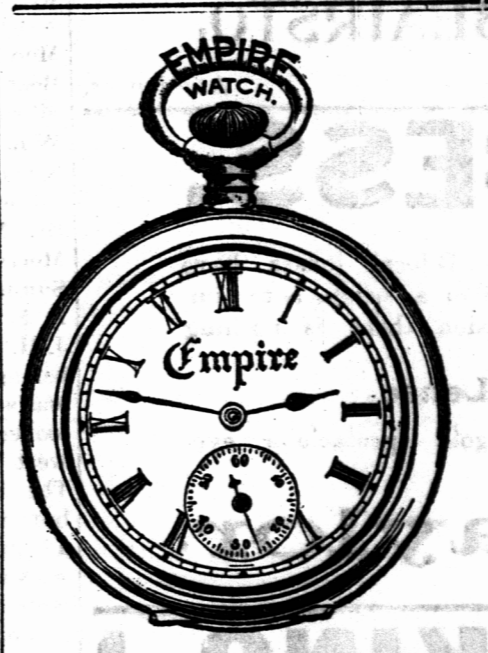

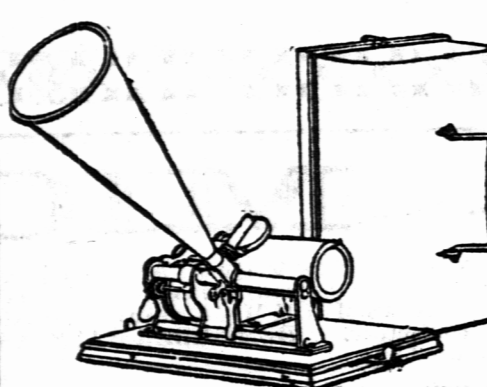

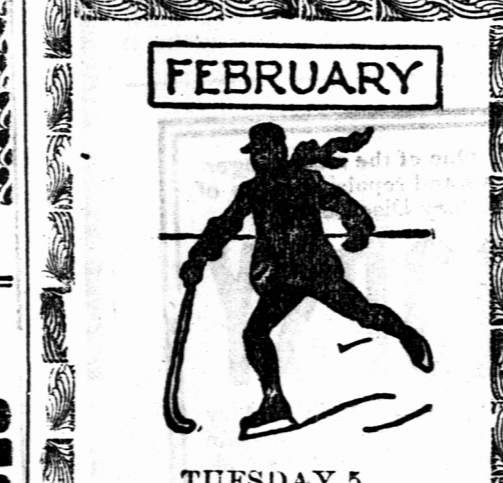
