The semi-annual examination of the Spring Valley school was held on Friday, the 28th Dec. The trustees and a large number of parents and visitors were present. The examination was conducted by the teacher, Mr. James A. Houston, and was in every way most satisfactory. There were about thirty pupils present and each reflected credit not only on himself but on the school as well, and it is safe to say that few schools in the province could be found to make such a creditable showing. The relations between the teacher and pupils are most cordial as was well exemplified at the close of the examination when Master Art. McKay, on behalf of his fellow pupils presented the teacher with a handsome Christmas present. In his reply the teacher thanked the pupils heartily, and commented for another year the happy relations by filling the pockets of all the children with candies and other Christmas confectionery. Mr. Houston has conducted the Spring Valley school for over ten years, which in itself speaks volumes for the esteem in which he is held by all interested in the welfare of the school.

Mr. SIX CARRUTHERS left Monday, on return to St. John, after spending the Christmas holidays with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Jas. Carruthers, North Bedouque. Mr. Carruthers is taking a full course in the Currie Business University, one of the largest and best equipped Commercial Schools in Canada. The Principal, Mr. James R. Currie, is a P. E. Islander, although educated in St. John, N. B. The University was opened some ten years ago, in a much smaller building than that occupied at present. About four years ago, increasing patronage made it necessary to secure more accommodation and the building known as Berryman's Hall was leased, the two upper flats fitted up with all modern appliances and conveniences, an additional staff of teachers engaged, and the school—put upon its present excellent footing. There are now six teachers and about 300 students. The full course includes bookkeeping, short hand, type-writing, commercial law, arithmetic, penmanship. A diploma from The Currie Business University is a guarantee of a thorough business training and a sure passport to success.
