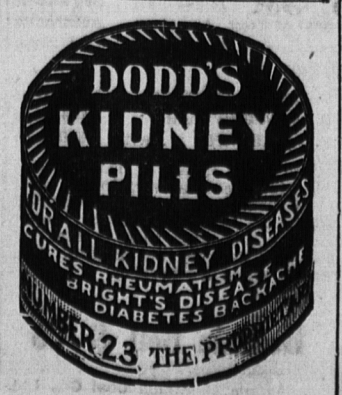
nice present which would always be a remembrance. Then all joined in singing the National Anthem. After which the visitors bade farewell to the teacher and expressed their regret at her departure.
