IN THE DAYS OF THE FIRST OF THE GEORGES

Trade names that have been established for fifty years in this country are few enough to be regarded as unique, and when we find one a hundred years old, it is singularly so. In the province of Nova Scotia there are two firms still in business that had their origin previous to 1790, and there are perhaps a few others in Canada, but not many. ORIGIN OF THE HALO.

St. Anselm's College Monthly (Roman Catholic) furnishes this interesting note.

"A halo is such a familiar attribute to a saint, perhaps, few people know or ever ask why the halo came into use. Its origin is quite simple. In the eleventh century, a period prolific in church and cathedral building, it was customary to place images of saints under the eaves outside the sacred buildings. In course of time the rainfall discolored the images, and some ingenious soul hit upon the idea of protecting them by placing wooden discs over the top of them to catch and divert the rain drippings.

"Giotto, the famous Italian, who introduced the halo into his pictures, in his country-bred ignorance, thought that the wooden plate represented something inseparable from the saint, and accordingly painted it. His artistic sense, however, revolted against its ugliness, and he gradually idealized it from a dark circle to the luminous rim which, now represents the badge, or rather symbol, of holiness."
