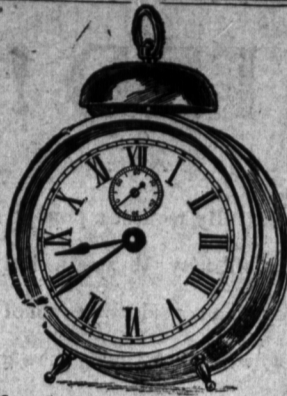

The outgoing cargo of the Stanley this morning will comprise 2 cars hogs, 1 car hay, 1 car smelts, 1 car empty casks, 1 car hides, and 4 cars freight, comprising poultry, beef, butter, etc., etc.

Last night a bitterly cold northeast gale sprang up and was accompanied by occasional snow squalls. The sudden change from rain in the morning rather surprised citizens who had to go out.

Capt. Peter McKenzie and Mrs. McKenzie of Piccola Landing N. S. arrived on the Island a few days ago and went to Hunter River Saturday evening, where they intend spending the greater part of the winter.

An example was made of two young girls at the Police Court yesterday for behaving in disorderly manner on the streets. The Magistrate gave them a warning which should be heeded by all acting in a similar manner.

Some good catches of codfish have recently been made by Island fishermen along the south shores of the Island. At Souris, and in that neighborhood, a number of men have had profitable work during the mild weather.

The Supreme Court will probably stand adjourned until next Monday. The Admiralty Court is still sitting, and the present case of the Magdalen Islands S. S. Co. and the ship Diana will probably occupy the Court a day or two longer.

Friends here of J. Heber Haslam, formerly of Springfield, in this Province, will be interested to learn that he is now actively engaged in the erecting of a large hotel block in Regina, which is to cost in the vicinity of a quarter million dollars.

The annual statement of the Dunstaffnage cheese and butter company, shows that for the year ended Oct. 31, 1906, 1,000,028 pounds of milk were manufactured into 46,350 lbs. of butter; gross value \$10,727.33; cost of manufacture, \$7,274.81. The average price for butter was 22.9 cts per lb.

David McKenzie, Flat River, Senior House Surgeon, of the Bellevue Hospital, New York, has been appointed to a lectureship in Cornell University. He will also be associated with a prominent New York surgeon in special surgical work. He holds the Bellevue position also until the spring.

The St. Catharines, Albert, Hockey team has recently been reinforced by a recruit from this Province, The Edmonton Bull Terrier's St. Catharines correspondent says: Scotty McLeod is a new comer, but has won the admiration of many spectators. He hails from Prince Edward Island where he had a reputation as a fast player. His work meets the approval of the crowd.

The Stanley arrived in Charlottetown at 11 a. m. yesterday, with 51 bags of mail and 25 passengers, including J. H. Winfield, manager of the Nova Scotia Telephone Company, and brother of W. A. Winfield, manager of the Prince Edward Island Telephone Company; John Jones of Sydney, formerly with R. E. Mutch & Co. of this city; M. Douglas and E. Doyle of the P. E. I. R., and Isaac Carter. She brought the following freight four cars of flour, one car of salt, and one car of marble.

THE GRAND JURY'S REPORT SUBMITTED TO CHIEF JUSTICE

The Jail, the Poorhouse, and the Hospital for Insane Visited.

The Report of the Grand Jury for the present Hilary Term, as submitted is as follows:—To His Lordship the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of P. E. Island. In accordance with their duty and the direction of the Court the Grand Jury visited and inspected Queen's County Jail the Poor House and the Provincial Hospital for Insane.

The Jail was found clean and well ventilated and altogether as comfortable as such an antique building can be expected to be. One of the prisoners only made complaint and that was for insufficient exercise. We beg to suggest that some occupation be provided for prisoners and that if, be possible, work of a productive kind.

The Poor House also was fairly clean and well ventilated, in view of the fact that forty-eight persons inhabit a building utterly unsuitable for the purposes of such an institution.

The Hospital for the Insane, with 227 patients, was found in excellent condition in every particular, well officered, clean and thoroughly ventilated.
