The community of Fredericton lost one of its most favorably known and respected citizens when Nelson S. J. Murray passed away on September the sixteenth.

Mr. Murray was born in Fredericton in Nov. 1870 and spent his boyhood days there, until his admission to P. W. College where he obtained a teacher's certificate. He taught for a number of years in several rural schools on the Island then returned to farm on the old Murray homestead in Fredericton. He was also a Justice of Peace and Notary Public for many years and all who came to him for advice and assistance found he was ever willing to pleasantly and efficiently help.

He was a member of Fredericton Christian Church and had capably served as church secretary for more than twenty years.
