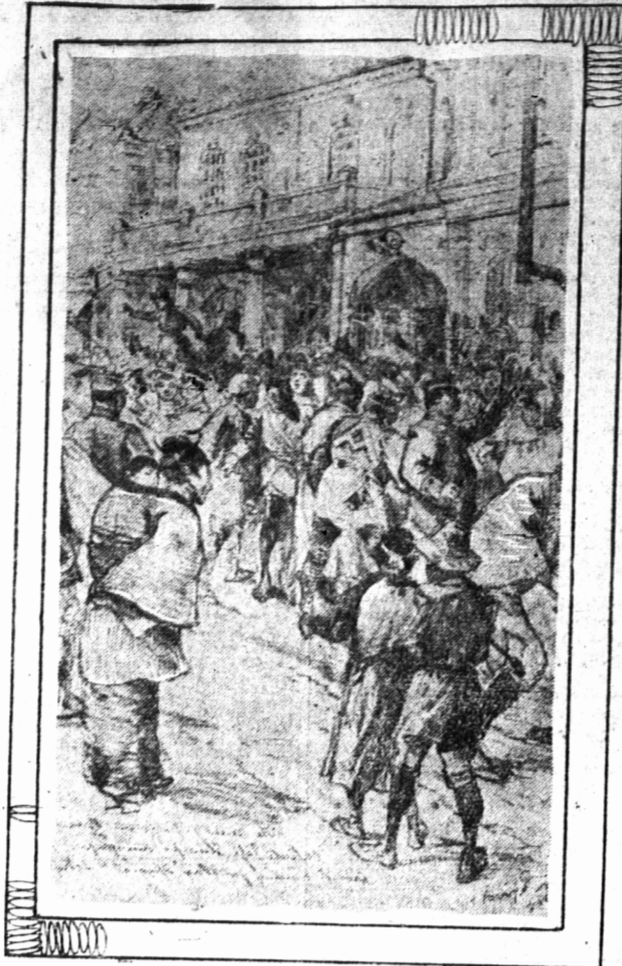

## OVERCOMING OBSTACLES

Eloquent Address Given by Rev. G. R. White.

Before the Young Men of the Y. M. C. A. Yesterday Afternoon—  
The Lions in the Pathway of Life.

The public meeting in the Y. M. C. A. yesterday afternoon was largely attended. The speaker of the day was Rev. G. R. White of the Prince-Street Baptist Church and he took for his subject Overcoming Obstacles. The following is a synopsis of his address:

The Holy Ghost paints some characters with a single stroke: "Enoch walked with God." "Caleb followed the Lord God wholly." In the 11th chapter of 1 Chronicles we have the biography of a hero written in few words: "Benaiah went down and slew a lion in a pit on a snowy day. Here is a man of pluck and muscle. While the dandies were sitting in chimney corners chattering their teeth, Benaiah was out slaying lions. These few words immortalize his bravery. 'He went down and slew a lion in a pit on a snowy day.' Benaiah, said the speaker, stands for faith, courage, purpose and that is the stuff out of which heroes are made. This age calls for a Daniel in Babylon, an Othello in the wicked courts of King Ahab, a Joseph in Egypt, or a Benaiah to slay the lions of Sin that haunt the walks of life. This is the young man's age and it is fast becoming what he makes it. The cry of this age is for the development of an early and strong manhood, physically, morally and spiritually. This age is calculated to develop a rounded manhood, as it touches all the faculties of his being. But there are great temptations in our day, lions which must be vanquished. The battle is on and we must fight to a finish.

Plato said: "He who would reach the desired end must overcome all obstacles." We note some of the lions that must be met and conquered.

**INTEMPERANCE.**  
How much manhood is slain by this lion of intemperance? Do you tell me the circumstances are against you. That was the case with Benaiah, his lion was in a pit, and the day was stormy. Drinking is not in good taste to day, even in society—the saloon is held in disgrace, which makes it much easier for young men to be teetotalers today than 25 years ago.

**EVIL COMPANIONS.**  
What a power for good or ill is here! John Wesley said he would have no companions only by choice. Young men choose your company; it is failure to choose that often leads to destruction. Spurgeon said, "When you see a bird flying and feeding and nesting with crows, you call it a crow and in ninety-nine cases out of an hundred you are right." The young man is known by the company he keeps.

**BAD HABITS.**  
Here is a cringing lion liable to spring upon you at any moment. What slaves men are to habits! Hitched to the neck of a gin bottle or tied to an old woodstock pipe or completely under the power of the

little cigarette, and then talk of their freedom! A man will tell more lies about his bad habits than any other one thing. The cultivated habits destroy all the natural ones and take full control of the man, and conquer his love for home, wife, and children. The gambling habit is on the increase today. Young men shun this cub in any form, for he will soon grow to a devouring monster.

**THEN THERE IS THE LION OF INDIFFERENCE.**  
He is so gentle that many sport with him. Paul calls this the "Sin of Neglect." It is not what you do, but what you leave undone or fail to do. "How shall we escape if we neglect so great Salvation? Let heaven, or earth, or hell answer if they can—escape there is none. We must awake and slay this lion of indifference or he will slay us. What a splendid excuse Benaiah could have put up for indifference, for the day was stormy and the lion in a pit. The story of Benaiah gives the charm to the whole story. Had the day been fine and the lion in the open, we would never have heard of Benaiah. We shall all thank God for the stormy days and pitiful lions for we grow while we conquer. It is the hard circumstances of life, when conquered, that put fiber into your muscle and iron in your blood, and lead on to heroism. For, "he that overcometh shall inherit all things."

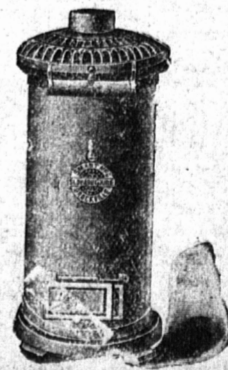
