Better Treatment For Aged Suggested

VICTORIA, B.C., May 4 (OP) — A plea that the aged be treated as "humans" was made yesterday by D.E. Chalmers of Regina, director of old age pensions for Saskatchewan. "People never get too old to want to feel they can be useful, to live and have friends," he told the western regional conference on social work here. "Loneliness seems to be a major problem with the aged... they, like all humans, can be hurt through neglect." Mr. Chalmers presented a four-point program for care of the Dominion's old people. It would include an adequate monthly pension; adequate housing; medical coverage; and recreational and counselling centres. The pension scheme, he said, could be either contributory or non-contributory.
