Twenty thousand dollars were expended for furniture alone, and the Government has been considerably criticised for such lavish treatment of German prisoners.

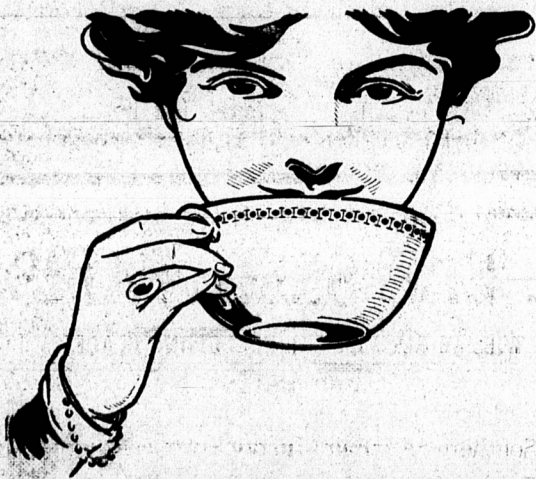
WASHINGTON, Feb. 24.—The Entente Allies have made representations to the United States that Germany is not meeting the cost of care of her prisoners of war in their camps and have asked the United States, as caring for the diplomatic interests of all the warring powers, to make representations to Berlin.

No Fault With the French.

PARIS, Feb. 24.—A despatch to the Havas Agency from Toulon says that the commissions sent out by the American Embassy in Paris to inquire into conditions of concentration camps in France have concluded their investigations in the department of Basse-Alpes and Var. They report having found international regulations strictly observed by the French authorities. To-day they left here for Corsica to continue their inspection.

THIRTY-FIVE WERE KILLED IN SINGAPORE RIOT.

LONDON, Feb. 24.—A communication issued late last night by the Colonial Office gives the casualties in the Singapore riot as thirty-five persons killed, including six officers and fifteen men of the local native forces, and fourteen residents of Singapore, one a woman.
