The Red Cross secretary took charge of one knitted sweater and two pairs gloves. More yarn was distributed. Mrs. Ellis Profit read the March contact, and also an extract from Dr. Lattimer's report. Mrs. George McLeod presented a very interesting contest, which was enjoyed by all. The collection was \$1.50. War Savings Stamps to the amount of \$12.25 were sold. Mrs. A. H. Campbell invited the members to her home for April meeting. The National Anthem was sung in closing. A dainty lunch was then served by the hostess in charge.

In a swift, dramatic action the Canadian Castle Class Corvette H. M. C. S. "St. Thomas" sank a German U-Boat recently. Part of an all Canadian convoy escort, the "St. Thomas", assisted by H. M. C. S. "Seacraft" forced the U-Boat to surface and sank it with deadly gunfire. The two ships then rescued the German crew including the Captain, four officers and fifty men.
