during the campaign he had met with the objection that the bootleggers were receiving profits which should go to the Government, and help reduce taxes. He said that in endeavoring to stamp out bootlegging the Government might go out of power by losing the support of those who wanted low taxes. He also thought the Government would lose the support of a great many people if it cut down the scripts. He

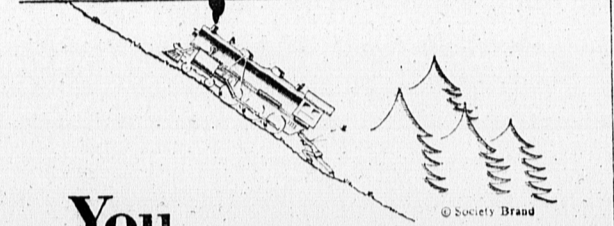
concluded with the Premier that the enforcement of the Act should not be a burden upon the taxpayers. He also approved of the suggestion of the Premier that the Alliance confer with the Commission.

The Alliance Lets in Light.
"As promised in October," says the Bulletin, "we have given in the foregoing pages of this number a rather extended report of the interview which took place between the Committee of the Temperance Alliance and the Provincial Government on the 11th October last. The resolutions of the Alliance

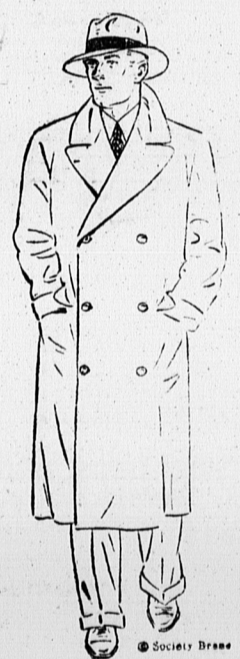
passed at its general meeting on September 16th, which out of courtesy have been withheld from publication until after they were presented to the Government, have now also been published.

"As will be seen by a perusal of the report of the interview, the statements made by Premier Saunders and the Alliance's representatives are not in agreement regarding what was understood to be the policy of the Government on the temperance question. This disagreement necessitates publication of the following detailed statement of what took place between the Premier and certain representatives of the Alliance, in order that the public may be able to determine whether or not there was justification for the statements made by the Alliance speakers to the public regarding the Government's temperance policy.

temperance workers was called to time to consult these persons during the current week owing to the budget debate being on, but said he would do so the following week. 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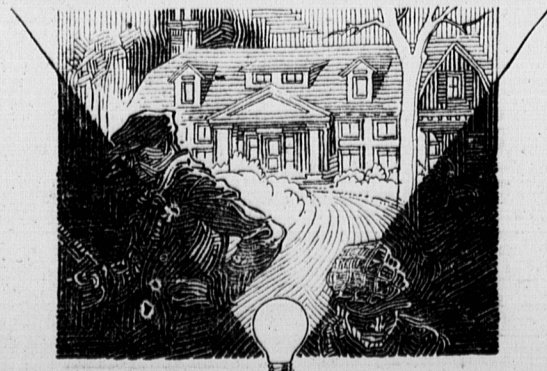


