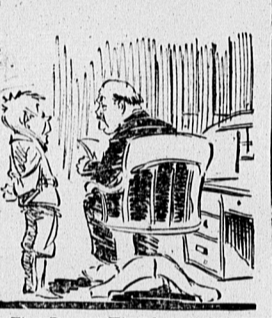

Market Prospect For Dressed Poultry

Within two months we will be offering our dressed poultry for sale. The question arises, will it be of good quality? During the past two months the market for poultry has increased considerably and at present, prices being offered are as good as last year.

In Canada we have dressed poultry standards. These are adopted and used as a trading basis. Each grade sets forth very plainly its requirements. The grades are not set as a means of lowering the price to the farmer, but for his protection. The dealer sets a price, one which he considers he can pay for each grade. If your poultry comes within the grade, you receive the price stated. The qualifications of the different grades may be secured by writing the Senior Poultry Promoter, Box 200, Charlottetown.

The largest percentage of poultry offered for sale around Christmas is chicken, or surplus cockerels. If you are looking for good prices this fall, the cockerels should immediately be separated from the pullets. They should be well fed and cared for, so as to bring them to maturity and place some flesh on them. A mash made up of cooked potatoes and one-third bran or midlings, mixed with skim milk may be given them twice daily. This mash to be fed in a trough—a quantity which they will clean up in half an hour. Hard grain may be fed morning and evening. This ration should be fed until about two or three weeks before marketing, when they are then placed in crates and finished on a grain mash. A mash consisting of home grown grains is as follows: equal parts of wheat, oats, barley and buckwheat, mixed with milk to a batter.

Do not say that by following the above recommendations you will secure the highest price, but it can be assured you will receive much better prices than if you didn't. A large number of chickens are hatched late and have not yet reached maturity, therefore will fatten slowly. The birds which were hatched early and are fully matured at the time of placing them in crates, should bring highest prices.

Many poultrymen believe they must market their poultry before Christmas to receive highest prices. This is not true, and farmers

should not sell until their poultry is fully matured and finished. Thousands of dollars are lost annually through marketing unfinished birds. By checking back for the past three years it has been found that prices paid in January and February were as good as in December. Do not market your poultry until it is fully finished. Properly finished poultry means higher prices for you. Immature, unfinished birds will bring low prices. Information on feeding, killing and plucking may be secured by writing Senior Poultry Promoter, Box 200, Charlottetown.
