LEO'S MILLIONS COME TO LIGHT

Gotti Returned Nine Million Dollars

Late Pontiff had Thought the Cardinal Would Succeed Him and Gave Him the Money to Use.

ROME, Dec. 18.—According to the Tribuna, the Vatican had sudden wealth poured into its coffers today. For some time certain sums which were known to be possessed by Pope Leo were looked for without result, the search toward the end becoming somewhat feverish.

Cardinal Gotti, prefect of the propaganda, accompanied by Monsignor Marzolini, one of the late Pope's secretaries, drove up to the Vatican today and getting out hurriedly began tugging at a heavy object in the carriage. Assistance was offered, but it was firmly refused and Cardinal Gotti and Mgr. Marzolini between them carried the mysterious object to the apartment of Pope Pius. They were immediately admitted and remained for two hours.

Intense curiosity was aroused by this act, as it was believed to have some relation to the missing wealth, and the wildest rumors were circulated. It soon became known, however, that the bag contained 45,000,000 francs (\$9,000,000) in bank notes.

EXTINCTION OF COREAN EMPIRE

BOSTON, Dec. 13.—Following close after the great raid on counterfeiters at Revere-United States secret service agents arrested in Boston today two men who, it is alleged, are as dangerous a pair of counterfeiters as the government has had to deal with for a long time. The men under arrest are Fred L. Wilson and Edward D. Wiggins; both claiming the title of doctors, which according to the officials, neither has the right to do so.

Wilson and Wiggins are not expert engravers, their work being wholly of a photographic nature. The counterfeit money alleged to have been made by them was so exact an imitation of government paper that it was readily accepted as genuine by most of the banks through which it passed. The secret service officials said tonight that not much of this bogus paper has been circulated as the men had been watched too closely.

BOGUS YANKEE MONEY AFLOAT

New England Banks were the Victims

United States Secret Service Arrest Two of the Slickest Counterfeiters that Country has yet had.

TOKYO, Dec. 15.—The view of the situation taken by the press and public continues to be very gloomy, and the prices of a coks are falling steadily. The newspapers make impatient and angry comments on the Russian reply to Japan's demand. Despite the official secrecy with which the reply is guarded the newspapers profess to know that it is unacceptable to Japan.

Baron Komura, Minister of Foreign Affairs, and Baron de Rosen, the Russian Minister, held a conference yesterday. Ministerial conferences and Ministerial visits to the diplomatists are frequent. A meeting of the senior statesmen has been arranged for tomorrow.

Corea professes indignation over the rioting of Korean coolies at Mokpho, which led to the landing of Japanese marines, but it is believed here that the incident was only of local importance. It is stated that the strike of the coolies was preceded by a general boycott of Japanese merchandise. It is understood that a Russian warship is going to Mokpho.

The cruising area of Japan's standing fleets has been extended to Korean and Chinese waters. This is regarded as giving a great advantage to the Japanese commander-in-chief.

Is Serious But Hopeful, no War Crisis is Imminent
